Welcome, Guests! We are so happy to have you join with us in worship this morning. We pray that you might experience God's blessing through His Word and the Christian fellowship that we share. If you do not currently have a church home, we invite you to consider joining us here at Shepherd of the Hills. Please, come again soon – and often!

The Lord's Supper is celebrated in our fellowship in the confession and glad confidence that as our Lord Jesus Himself says, He gives us to eat and to drink not only bread and wine, but also His very body and blood for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who have been baptized, who trust in His words, who repent of all sin, and who set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Holy Scripture urges those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood to first examine themselves that they may partake in full understanding and a shared confession of Christian faith. In loving concern for those who desire to partake, we encourage those who are not yet instructed, who are in doubt, or who hold to a confession differing from that of this congregation of the Lutheran Church- Missouri Synod, to first make an appointment to visit with Pastor Rust. For further study, please see Matthew 5:23ff; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Corinthians 11:17-24.

Preparation for Communion: Communicants are encouraged to review "Christian Questions with Their Answers," found on pages 329-330 in the *Lutheran Service Book.* You will also find prayers for use before and after communing inside the front cover of the hymnal. May yours be a joyful and blessed communion!



Old Testament Reading

Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-26

²Vanity of vanities, says the Preacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity....

¹²I the Preacher have been king over Israel in Jerusalem. ¹³And I applied my heart to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven. It is an unhappy business that God has given to the children of man to be busy with. ¹⁴I have seen everything that is done under the sun, and behold, all is vanity and a striving after wind. . . .

¹⁸I hated all my toil in which I toil under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to the man who will come after me, ¹⁹and who knows whether he will be wise or a fool? Yet he will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. ²⁰So I turned about and gave my heart up to despair over all the toil of my labors under the sun, ²¹because sometimes a person who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave everything to be enjoyed by someone who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. ²²What has a man from all the toil and striving of heart with which he toils beneath the sun? ²³For all his days are full of sorrow, and his work is a vexation. Even in the night his heart does not rest. This also is vanity.

²⁴There is nothing better for a person than that he should eat and drink and find enjoyment in his toil. This also, I saw, is from the hand of God, ²⁵for apart from him who can eat or who can have enjoyment? ²⁶For to the one who pleases him God has given wisdom and knowledge and joy, but to the sinner he has given the business of

gathering and collecting, only to give to one who pleases God. This also is vanity and a striving after wind.

¹If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. ³For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

⁵Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. ⁶On account of these the wrath of God is coming. ⁷In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. ⁸But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. ⁹Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices ¹⁰and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. ¹¹Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.
