My choice for this month is: "In Christ Alone". We sing this song at least every two months and each time it resonates with rich meaning. This is the most sung hymn that written in this century throughout the world.

The Story Behind In Christ Alone

Written in 2002, "In Christ Alone" was the first collaborative effort between Townend and fellow songwriter (and now good friend) Keith Getty. "The song came about in an unusual way," Townend explains. "Keith and I met in the autumn of 2000 at a worship event, and we resolved to try to work together on some songs. A few weeks later Keith sent some melody ideas, and the first one on the CD was a magnificent, haunting melody that I loved, and immediately started writing down some lyrical ideas on what I felt should be a timeless theme commensurate with the melody. So the theme of the life, death, resurrection of Christ, and the implications of that for us just began to tumble out, and when we got together later on to fine tune it, we felt we had encapsulated what we wanted to say."

In Christ alone my hope is found;
He is my light, my strength, my song;
This cornerstone, this solid ground,
Firm through the fiercest drought and storm.
What heights of love, what depths of peace,
When fears are stilled, when strivings cease!
My comforter, my all in all—
Here in the love of Christ I stand.

In Christ alone, Who took on flesh,
Fullness of God in helpless babe!
This gift of love and righteousness,
Scorned by the ones He came to save.
Till on that cross as Jesus died,


In addition to enjoying brunch and time with each other on the 19th, the altar guild will make a donation to a local charity chosen during the brunch.
