

Haiti

Asbury Memorial responds to A CALL FOR HELP

UMCOR has made an urgent requests for Health Kits for Haiti. Members are asked to prepare these and bring them to Worship on February 7th. These

must be exact or time will be wasted at UMCOR going through and making corrections. These are used to provide basic necessities to individuals and also serve as learning tools in personal hygiene, literacy, nutrition and cooking classes. Each health kit should contain all new items and be sealed in a 1 gallon zip-lock bag.

Contents:

- 1. 1 hand towel (15" x 25" up to 17" x 27", No kitchen towels
- 2. 1 washcloth
- 3. 1 comb (large and sturdy, not pocket-sized)
- 4. 1 nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- 5. 1 bath-size bar of soap (3 oz. and up)
- 6. 1 toothbrush (single brush only in original wrapper. No child-size brushes)
- 7. 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages
- 8. \$1.00 to purchase toothpaste (toothpaste is purchased by UMCOR)

You may also purchase some of these items in multi-packs (except toothbrushes) and turn them in to help make additional kits at the mission facility.

DELIVERY HELP NEEDED

We will deliver these to Merci Mission Center, a drop off facility in Goldsboro, NC. We'll leave Tuesday February 9th at 9:00 a.m. and return Saturday the 13th. We will be remaining at the facility through Friday, February 12th to assist in any way we can to help pack kits or whatever their greatest need is at the time. They have facilities to house us and we will organize our own meals. Contact Grady Mills if you would like to participate.
