CALL TO CONFESSION

Like a tenacious toddler, Peter was full of questions, because Peter was eager to learn.

I wish I was more like that.

So friends, let's be like Peter.

Let's return to Christ with the humility of a student

and may our curiosity carry our faith into deeper waters.


With hope and humility we pray. Amen.



It is right to give our thanks and praise.


PREFACE




TABLE BLESSING


BLESSING
