The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an usher.

THE CALL PROCESS - A Primer, part 6

If after prayerful consideration our Pastor leaves, we begin the process of asking God for a new Pastor. Normally, the departing Pastor will have nothing to do with deciding on the vacancy Pastor or with suggesting names of possible persons to become the next Pastor.

This is also a "divine call." That means God is somehow involved in this process and it is not just some sort of business transaction. Some congregations struggle with that balance between the business world and the church. We must avoid that confusion of elements and seek to maintain an appropriate balance.

The search process usually begins by giving thanks to God for the ministry that has gone on until now, and for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in leading their Pastor elsewhere, and telling the congregation that it is time for someone new to begin. The congregation should also express the confidence that God is wise enough and helpful enough to get the right person to the right congregation if they will go to the trouble of praying and thinking hard about what is right and wise to do.

Members of the congregation have the right to nominate Pastors for their call list. While there are many capable seminaries and other educational institutions, Abiding Savior, as a member of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, agrees to call only Pastors who are graduates of one of our LC-MS seminaries. All nominations from the congregation are sent to the District President for his input before any vote can occur. The District President will take any congregation nominations and add to them others which he feels appropriate based on the congregation's Pastor profile. He will then send data regarding the nominees to the congregation.

There are many ways a Call Committee can be established. This is usually specified in the church constitution. At Abiding Savior, the Call Committee is appointed by the Church Council. Their task is to review the list of nominees and provide recommendations to a Voters Meeting. This should be done in a timely way by the Call Committee. This is also done with a certain confidentiality. While the Call Committee's progress can be shared with the congregation, any particular information on nominees remains confidential to the Call Committee and is not to be shared.

The ultimate task of the Call Committee is to gather whatever information they need to bring good recommendations to the voters. They will prayerfully review the information provided about each nominee. They will use whatever avenues seem appropriate to sort through the list of nominees. This may include personal interviews and other contact with nominees that will help the Call Committee come to a decision. The voters need to trust the work of the Call Committee as they investigate each nominee. That is why the committee was selected, to do this work in the name of and with the blessing of the congregation. All voting members should also make every attempt to be part of this process as they may be asked. This will be a new Pastor for all the people.

Confession And Absolution

- Through the prophet Zephaniah the Lord tells His people to rejoice and not fear, because He is in our midst.
- **Q** We confess that we have too often let the problems of this world distract us from God's protection and blessings. We have not recognized His presence among us. We repent and ask God to restore us to more confident faith and rejoicing.
- P In urging us to rejoice and offer our prayers with thanksgiving, Paul promises that God's peace will guard our hearts and minds.
- We confess that we have been anxious about many things. Our prayers have not been offered confidently. We repent of all our sin and ask God to protect us so that both our thoughts and our emotions may reflect the peace that He provides.


(Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.)

And I believe in the Holy Spirit,


the Lord and giver of life,


