Go for the Gold! - Pastor Jack

February of 2022 brings the Winter Olympics. There have been requests for our American competitors to boycott these games for various reasons, from the policies of China to COVID and its variants. All the athletes involved spent many months, even years, training for their moment at the Olympic Games. This makes a boycott request a difficult decision.

The ultimate goal for each athlete is the gold medal, the symbol of victory. It marks one as the best in the world in that particular event. Some come to the Olympic Games with a real chance at the gold, along with a firm expectation of winning that medal. Some will accept nothing less than a gold medal, feeling as if anything else would mean failure. Many come with a slim hope of a gold medal, but cherish the opportunity to take part, to be worthy of the competition. Quite an array of emotions are present in each event, as some athletes achieve a new "personal best" or the occasional unexpected victory or loss. For most this is a once in a lifetime opportunity.

Paul often compares our Christian life to the running of a race. He says we should "run with perseverance the race marked out for us" with our eyes fixed on Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of our faith. He reminds us that while only one wins the crown, we all "press on toward the goal" as we race. Our race involves moving in the footsteps of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

That "race" we call life brings with it many joys and sorrows. The many challenges of day-to-day situations may also throw in an occasional unexpected victory or loss. At times we may want to boycott or step back from the task before us. These past two years have been especially difficult with changing parameters and at times conflicting information. This current section of our race involves navigating the COVID effects as well as preparing for a new shepherd at Abiding Savior. We cannot let the fear and uncertainty of the future cloud our judgment or distort our path.

As those trained by our loving Lord and Savior, we know we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us. We can daily "go for the gold," which is the crown of life promised by God to all His faithful. Let that goal provide clarity, focus and strength in our daily walk, both in our individual lives and our life together as a congregation.

The Great Sending - A Study During Lent

President Walton of our Florida-Georgia District has declared 2022 as The Great Sending Year of Jubilee. Each chapter of the book connects God's heart to your own through a deep dive into Scripture. Rev. Dr. Dale Meyer, former Lutheran Hour speaker and former President of our Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, wrote, "Today many parishioners, clergy, and church leaders are befuddled by a public culture that doesn't accept absolute truth, a society wherein the church no longer has special privilege, and where congregational life often seems to have lost its energy for gathering and outreach. This much-needed volume takes us to God's

inexhaustible source for faith and guidance, the living voice of the Gospel in God's Word."

All our members are invited to join together and study this book as part of our midweek services during Lent, beginning Wednesday, March 2nd. Each week we will focus on a main chapter theme, like Engaging Disciples in the Great Sending, and The Great Sending Essentials. The book also provides short daily devotions to use between services. These chapters will help guide us, maybe for the first time, out of the sanctuary into the streets, out of our comfort zones and into community, out of our affinity groups to meet people who are perishing without Jesus. It may lead to new conversations among our members. It's not just a book to read. It's a way to immerse yourself in God's Word. It's a way of connecting you and others to Jesus.

We ask all who are interested to sign up so we can order enough books for this study. A signup sheet is available in the narthex. Plan now to join this study each week, either live in church or by livestream.

Why Lutherans Love to Sing

We have so many talented voices at Abiding Savior. It is good to hear the singing each week at our worship services, even with a small, scattered group. The following was broadcast on National Public Radio April 25, 2000, by Garrison Keillor on his Lake Wobegon program.

"I have made fun of Lutherans for years. Who wouldn't if you lived in Minnesota! But I have also sung along with Lutherans, and that is one of the main joys of life, along with hot baths and fresh sweet corn.

We make fun of Lutherans for their blandness, their excessive calm fear of giving offense, their constant guilt that burns like a pilot light, their lack of speed, and also for their secret fondness for macaroni and cheese. But NOBODY sings like them!

If you ask an audience in New York City, a relatively "Lutheran-less" place, to sing along on the chorus of "Michael Row the Boat Ashore" they will look daggers at you as if you had asked them to strip to their underwear. But if you do this among Lutherans, they'll smile and row the boat ashore and up the beach and down the road!

And Lutherans are bred from childhood to sing in four-part harmony. It's a talent that comes from sitting on the lap of someone singing alto or tenor or bass, and hearing the harmonic intervals by putting your little head against that person's rib cage. It's natural for Lutherans to sing in harmony.

Why Lutherans Love to Sing Continued

We're too modest to be soloists, it's too worldly to sing in unison. And when you sing in the key of C and you slide into the A7th and D7th chords, all two hundred of you, it's an emotionally fulfilling moment.

I once sang the bass line of "Children of the Heavenly Father" in a room with about three thousand Lutherans in it. And when we finished we all had tears in our eyes, partly from the promise that God will not forsake us, partly from the proximity of all those lovely Lutheran voices. By joining in harmony, we somehow promise that we will not forsake each other.

I do believe this people who love to sing in four-part harmony are the sort of people you could call up when you're in deep distress. If you're dying, they'll comfort you. If you're lonely, they'll talk to you. If you're hungry, they'll give you tuna salad!"
