There are many ways to approach the resurrection. You can approach it philosophically and try to analyze it. You can approach it Biblically and try to understand the context out of which it came. You can approach it critically and discuss rational reasons for believing or not believing it. You can approach it pragmatically and seek to discover what it all means. Or you can approach it experientially and feel the impact of this event on your life.

Two emotions are recorded in the first Easter experience. The first is wonder. Three Greek words are used to describe this emotional reaction. One is “phobeo,” from which we get our word “phobia.” The basic idea is fear. It means to be so frightened you want to run away. A second word is “ecstasis,” from which we get our word “ecstasy.” It means holy frenzy or enthusiasm. The third word is “ekthambeo.” This word means astonishment or wonder. Something extraordinary happened that day, and the emotional reaction was one of wonder.

The second emotion expressed is joy. Several accounts of the resurrection and the appearances of the resurrected Jesus show people “rejoicing” or leaving “with great joy” in their hearts. The defeat of Calvary has been reversed by the victory of the empty tomb, and the emotional reaction is joy.

Some say we have lost this sense of wonder and joy today, that we are too afraid of being emotional or getting caught up in the experience of our faith. We hear again of God’s victory over sin, death and the power of the devil, and we yawn with indifference or simply go through the motions of yet another Easter celebration.

The great Easter truth is not that we are to live anew after death – but that we are to be new here and now by the power of the resurrection! That is the most stupendous victory that has ever been won! Since that first Easter we have lived in the assurance that the ultimate victory belongs to God. There is no better reason for our joy and wonder.

Plan to join us as together we celebrate the victory that is ours through the life, death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

"Then the King will say to those on his right. 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.' Then the righteous will answer him saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'"

The Abiding Savior Preschool kiddos have been singing a terrific song in chapel lately. The refrains lyrics go like this:

*Refrain: I am the church, you are the church, we are the church! Together,
all who follow Jesus, all around the world, we are the church together!"*

I'm reminded of a few of the many times this has been made evident in the musical life here at Abiding Savior Lutheran Church. When I first arrived here five years ago, I came from a bit of a different background that was a bit liturgical but not Lutheran. Worship resources like the LSB and the rich history of choral music reflected in the choral library provided common ground for me and the choir. Meanwhile, in the praise team, I found that the music I first played as a kid in the church happened to be much of the same music Ralph Toppins played when he first started playing guitar in church as well. Much of Christendom, regardless of denomination, share a large body of "standard repertoire." Despite all this commonality, I was perceived by many as different around here as different could be. *There was a "normal" that we were all searching for; Boy, did we miss the days of normalcy.*

all who follow Jesus, all around the world, we are the church together!"*

When the pandemic struck and we had to quickly transition to pre-recording services, I found myself limited to what music I could record by myself in the sanctuary without chorus or praise team, or what I could record in my home studio. We worked hard to blend what we could offer to give as many as possible a taste of what they were missing while we couldn't be in person in worship. This meant a bit more praise music for the first service folks who were used to the organ, and a little more organ for those who attended late service and were used to the praise team. *There was a "normal" that we were all searching for; Boy, did we miss the days of normalcy.*

*The church is not a building, The church is not a steeple.
The church is not a resting place, The church is a people.*

*Refrain: I am the church, you are the church, we are the church! Together,
all who follow Jesus, all around the world, we are the church together!"*

When we returned to in-person worship, we tried our best to "get back to normal" in the best way we could. Folks had moved away, and personal losses or other issues meant our praise team was very small, most of the time just Hannah, me, and Ralph. The choir couldn't meet. At the time, we wouldn't have more than 25-30 people in worship on Sunday morning, and even then very distant from each other. First service folks were attending the second service and second service folks were attending the first service.

The question arose, “how can we support the congregation so that they will keep singing despite masking and being spread out?” The best answer was to support congregational song with the organ in both services. Even if you were alone in your corner of the room, the big voice of the organ made it safe to sing without fear. The praise team played from time to time, as things allowed. *There was a “normal” that we were all searching for; Boy, did we miss the days of normalcy.*

*And when the people gather, There's singing and there's praying,
There's crying and there's laughing, All of it saying:*

*Refrain: I am the church, you are the church, we are the church! Together,
all who follow Jesus, all around the world, we are the church together!”*

In the days before the Delta Variant the choir began meeting again. They wore masks as a rule, and people were conspicuously missing... not the least of which was our beloved Tenor 2, Pastor Alan, who had passed a few months before. People were still missing from our in-person lives in general. Singing together was more difficult with the smaller numbers and with grief over missing people. The praise team was still small, though we were playing more often. We were all hoping this relief would be sustained. As things began to creep back toward something that resembled “the before times” it became more and more apparent that things were irrevocably changed.

Then, after the summer of 2021, Delta became a problem. The choir was delayed in returning to rehearsals. The praise team was still small. Things felt “normal” in terms of Covid19 issues – cancelled events, cancelled holidays, cancelled rehearsals, delayed weddings, delayed funerals, delayed closure and resolution. Yes, much cancellation but certainly no cancelled hope, joy, and thanksgiving despite the trials we all faced together. Despite all that triumph and faithful perseverance, it was still... different. *There was a “normal” that we were all searching for; Boy, did we miss the days of normalcy.*

Even now when church staff discusses things and the inevitable question is asked “what have we done ordinarily?”, we search for some beginning of an answer to such an unfair question. The choir has been singing each week. The praise team has grown to 8-9 members and leads our musical worship every week. First service folks have migrated slowly back to attending the first service and the same for the folks in the second service. One might even hazard to say that things are kind of back to... (dare I say it?)

Yet, I am regularly in receipt of questions and in conversation with my fellow brothers and sisters in each service who lovingly, longingly, compassionately, fervently, sadly, joyously, sincerely, graciously, ask: “When might we get back to _____?” – “When will _____ happen?” “Why is this/that different?” More and more I find that I don’t have a succinct answer. *There seems to be a normal we’ve all been searching for.*

If we look for that “*normal*” in **matters of opinion or preference**, *normal* is such a fleeting thing. Hymns might be slower or faster than in the past when I play them at the organ, and I daresay my tempi are probably slightly affected by what I’ve had for breakfast. Song selections may differ from what’s been done before or will be done later. Candles burn oil and must be replaced or refilled. Old procedures are replaced as new ones are considered. People realize their gifts and others realize their end. Paraments fade in the sunlight. Banners grow loose and stretched, along with our skin. Beloved people leave us for their heavenly mansions and beloved people enter our Christian family through birth, baptism, and conversion. Everything is changing all of the time.

If we look for that “*normal*” in **matters of faith**, in the things that are always constant and unchanging, we find that God has never left us. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Despite the many and various ways we express it, each and every time we are together, we pray. We study as the word of God is proclaimed in preaching, reading, and singing. We confess our sins and receive the Lord’s absolution spoken by the pastor. Our Lord Jesus is present in, with, and under the bread and the wine regardless of it being served for us on silver or earthenware plates, in individual cups or the common cup, at the rail or at the foot of the chancel steps, or lovingly brought to those who must stay in their pew.

It has been tempting to ask God, *where are you? When will we have what we love back? When will all this nonsense end and we can get on with the goings on as normal?* I give thanks to God that while I was pursuing some “normal” that He was in pursuit of me. I give thanks that while we have lovingly and rightly worried over fading paraments or building maintenance that the Lord has given us eyes to see them and light of the sun to see them by.

It’s only natural to seek comfort in what is familiar; but maybe as we look around for that “normal” we all seem to search for, we can look through the lens of a manger, a cross, and an empty tomb and be reminded of the sweet and simple refrain of another beloved chapel song:

Yes, Jesus loves me!

Yes, Jesus loves me.

Yes, Jesus loves me;

The bible tells me so.


