Chosen by God: To Be One Sent - Pastor Jack

Two of the most highly watched sporting events on television are not with teams of athletes competing against each other. Rather, they involve the drafting of players for the National Football League (NFL) and the National Basketball Association (NBA) teams. Faithful fans watch for many hours to see who is chosen by which team, or to see whom their favorite team will choose. People watched even in the midst of a pandemic.

Most of us will not be chosen by professional sports teams, but as Christians we receive a higher calling. Jesus says, "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit." God has made us a part of His team. We are not chosen by God because we are successful in our careers, great athletes, or wealthy. God chose ordinary people to do extraordinary things.

As the mission of God and His sending form the lens through which we read the Bible, we begin to see how from the beginning God's desire has been to send His people into the world to proclaim the Good News. During Lent we looked at The Great Sending and how God, out of love, sent His only Son, Jesus, into the world to redeem us from our sin.

Through faith we understand that we are among the foolish and weak through whom God carries out His life-saving work. Paul calls us jars of clay, and says that God entrusts us – clay jars – with this treasure of the Gospel. As humble people of faith, we are empowered by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. He transforms and molds us. It is God who does the drafting and changing. Through faith we will stay on God's team, and we will bear the fruit that He calls us to bear. We are the chosen of God. Each of us is one sent – to proclaim His Word.

At a recent Pastors' conference a simple example was used which I have shared with you here at Abiding Savior. It involved the lowly penny. Some still say, "A penny for your thoughts," but others say we should eliminate the penny from our system. They say it costs more to make than it is worth. In the past you may have had purchasing power with a penny. These days it is difficult to find anything costing only a penny.

What hasn't changed is that a penny is still one cent. As Christians we often feel under appreciated in our world, like the lowly penny. However, like that penny, you are one SENT (notice the spelling). God has sent you into the world to share the love of Jesus. I encourage you to carry a penny with you as a reminder that you are one sent – chosen and sent by Jesus into the world. The professional athletes who are drafted are expected to perform. They are paid large sums of money to do very athletic things. As God's chosen people, we may not receive large paychecks, but our benefits are out of this world! We are eager to use our lives and resources in God's service for His glory.

By the way, a penny may not hold much value in and of itself, but when you put a bunch of pennies together the value increases. Paul wrote, "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." As we work together for God's Kingdom, connecting hearts to Jesus, there is no end to what God can and will do. What a privilege it is to be part of and serving on God's winning team!

We recently received word that Pastor James Krach, one of the three candidates the Committee presented to the voters on February 27, has accepted a call to be Senior Pastor at Hope Lutheran Church in Bradenton. This means that Pastor Graham Glover is the only hold-over candidate under consideration in this second phase.

The Committee plans to move as quickly as possible in its review of the candidates. We remind all that Committee discussions are private and confidential and we ask everyone to respect the process by not attempting to influence or interfere in any way at any time. The Committee is mindful that this is a Divine process in which God leads us to our next pastor.
