The Holy Spirit is the subject of much conversation and speculation. Pentecost is celebrated on the fiftieth day (seventh Sunday) after Easter. It is considered the third main festival of our Christian Church Year after Christmas and Easter. It is also perhaps the most overlooked of the main festivals, compared to the celebrations surrounding Christmas and Easter. Have you attended a Pentecost Party or exchanged gifts on Pentecost?

Jesus spoke openly and clearly about the Holy Spirit. On Pentecost Sunday, June 5th this year, we focus on the identity of the Holy Spirit. Who is He? How is He related to our world? What does He do?

The Holy Spirit is variously described, depending partly on the translation of the Greek word, Paraclete. Literally, the word means “called alongside.” We understand the Holy Spirit to stand alongside us in our witnessing and in our worrisome problems. The term is also translated “Comforter,” as one on whom we can depend in grief and anxiety. We may cry on His shoulder. Sometimes the translation “Advocate” is used, indicating a legal relationship of protection. He becomes our defender against those who would harm us. Often the translation “Helper” is used, a broad term suggesting many activities of the Holy Spirit.

The variety of translations indicates an understanding of His person and work in many diverse situations. Some have used the example of a coach, who is required by rules to stay off the field of play during the game or match, but often calls out from the sidelines – words of encouragement, of rebuke, of information. In that sense He is calling alongside. This is something of the activity of the Holy Spirit, though He can’t be kept from the field.

He is God in our midst. The faithful preaching of the disciples, the preservation of the story of God in both oral and written form, bear evidence of the Holy Spirit’s witness. As Jesus was the “Word made flesh,” so the Holy Spirit in truth assumes our flesh in the continuation of the Incarnation. God has not left us alone. He is in our midst.

He will also reprove the world for the sin of not believing the Son. He will reprove the world of judgment in the ultimate defeat of sin. Thus the Holy Spirit becomes our Advocate in a legal sense, heaping up the evidence on our behalf – and on behalf of God’s Son.

He guides us into all truth. He will confirm the truth of Jesus’ ministry and set it in the context of world history as well as our day and age. The Holy Spirit, the Spirit of truth, will be closely aligned with the truth about Jesus. Thus Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are all loyal to the truth.

He is not a passive existence. The Holy Spirit will actively guide our lives into all truth. When the Holy Spirit made His presence known that first Pentecost, all the followers of Jesus were empowered to speak the truth about Jesus so all could hear and learn. Simon Peter was empowered to speak boldly to the crowd about the truth of what was happening. Witnessing is the spirit of Pentecost. The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Pentecost.

Speaking in Tongues?!?

The day of Pentecost was marked with the followers of Jesus speaking in tongues. The book of Acts records, “And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.” This seemed to be the many languages of the people who gathered, for it is also recorded, “...each one was hearing them speak in his own language.”

One of the great deceptions we tell our children is “sticks and stones may break my bones, but names will never hurt me.” Words are powerful. Words meant a lot to people on the day of Pentecost. It brought a message of salvation, and about 3,000 came to the faith that day.

In our day it often seems there is a “poverty of language” as fewer seem to respect the rights and wrongs of appropriate language. Many are using language that would have made a sailor blush forty years ago. Words have the power to hurt us. Terry Dittmer, who served as Director of Youth Ministry in the LCMS, wrote about this some years ago in an article titled, “I Swear – I’d Really Rather You Didn’t.”

He writes, “Blame it on the media (that’s the easiest thing to do these days), blame it on the lowering of standards and values in general in our society, blame it on people just not caring – it doesn’t make any difference whom you blame. The use of vulgar language is on the rise.”

Dittmer goes on to say, “God is clear in His Word that we are to be careful about the words we use – about what comes out of our mouths. Check out Ephesians 5:4: ‘Nor should there be obscenity, foolish talk or coarse joking, which are out of place, but rather thanksgiving.’ The use of foul language just isn’t necessary.”

Dittmer suggests it is time to reconstruct polite conversation, and it must start at home. He offers some direction as to how that could happen.

First, if you are a parent, survey your own language. Dittmer comments, “Your kids are learning their language from you. It’s not long before your toddler picks up any loose expletives.”

Second, if you are a “frivolous swearer,” resolve to quit. Dittmer says, “The author of Proverbs made this observation: He who guards his lips guards his life, but he who speaks rashly will come to ruin (13:3). There is hope and promise if we mind our tongues.”

Third, establish a standard for your household. There are certain words that are inappropriate and unacceptable under your roof for anyone. Dittmer admits, “This one becomes a bit challenging, especially for your teens. I wish I could say that my kids always adhere to this rule...I have to admit that I’m pretty certain that some words are used outside our home when they are in the company of their friends that they do not use at home. But I know they know what the unacceptable words are even if they do slip.”

Fourth, when those unacceptable words pop up in the media, on TV, in movies or elsewhere, point out your displeasure. Dittmer adds, “It doesn’t take long for your kids to catch on. They will even begin to notice their own displeasure.”

Fifth, you may want to give your children alternatives for those times they feel frustrated or angry. Dittmer suggests, “Words like strawberries, or nonsense words like flibberdegibbit. What these kinds of words often do is take the tension out of a situation.”

Finally, gauge your language and help your children gauge theirs in terms of prayer words. Dittmer says, “Stop and ask yourself if you would use those words before God. If you wouldn’t use a word in conversation with God Himself, don’t use it in conversation with anybody.”

Dittmer concludes, “Now some may say this is no big deal; it’s making mountains out of a molehill. And by society’s standards, maybe it is. But we have a higher calling, a higher standard, and just because everybody else doesn’t seem to care, that doesn’t mean we shouldn’t. As St. Paul says, ‘Let your conversation always be full of grace’ (Colossians 4:6). And what a wonderful world it would be.”

What a laudable goal for us all as we use our tongues and speak: that what comes out of our mouths is good, that our words are full of praise and thanksgiving to God, and encouragement, praise and blessing for each other. May it be so in your home.
