The Cost of Dreaming - Pastor Jack

It is hard to believe that this month of July completes my time here at Abiding Savior. Much has happened in our time together, some things exuding joy and some bringing frustration. Yes, I still have hopes and dreams for the future of Abiding Savior. The best is yet to come. Your task is not complete. The job is not finished.

Often we question our dreams, our commitments, the way we're spending our time for that which we believe good and worthwhile. There is nothing in the Bible that says we won't become discouraged and disheartened. Doors are often closed. Windows are slammed shut. Dreams are at times expensive. They often require us to leave some security that has become comfortable to us. Even Jesus asked, "When the Son of Man comes, will He find any faith at all?"

Our Lord's dream was expensive. It took Him places where the brave dared not go. It took Him into situations where people refused to become involved. He got His hands dirty, His heart broken, and His security shattered. You can't be selfish and dream Christ's dream. When Jesus talked about the Kingdom, He said two things that have stayed on my mind as Abiding Savior moves forward with a new Pastor.

First, He said the Kingdom will be like a mustard seed. It would start small, but it wouldn't stay small. Once it had been planted, God would nurture and water that seed. We would give our time, our energy, and life itself to help His Kingdom come on earth. That's what He said. And that's what is happening all over the world, even in our midst.

I hope and pray that as things move forward under the guidance and direction of a new pastor they continue to do so under the watchful eye of our Abiding Savior. There will be one more all-volunteer meeting. If you're already signed up to volunteer - or if you're still interested - please join us in the FLC on July 17 after late service.




Texas District - Help for Uvalde Community
