# Good, Better, Best... - Joshua Mazur

... Never let it rest; 'till the good gets better, and the better gets best.

If you're from the south, you may have grown up hearing this idiom recited all the time by your parents and/or grandparents. It was a common refrain around my house. It seemed to feel encouraging when I wasn't doing well at something. It was a subtle exhortation to continue working and thinking when I began to feel accomplished in one way or another, and it was a less-than-subtle reminder that I had a long way to go in life when I was found on some high horse.

My parents/family were wise to teach this lesson. What they didn't quite grasp (and what I hope to add to their lesson when God grants me my own children) is that "better" and "best" are not always improvement upon something. Most of the time, "better" and "best" are merely change.

The platforms you see in our choir room are wonderful things to have, but when the day comes that one or more of the members of the choir can't walk up stairs? Things will need to change. Many people love the look and meaningful symbolism of choir robes, but after a few people became overheated and unwell due to their heaviness? Things have needed to change. When people die or leave or come or go from our midst? Things change.

As we have concluded our pastoral search and received a new servant of Christ as our Pastor here in Rev. Graham Glover, we enter a new chapter at Abiding Savior Lutheran Church. I'm sure there will be changes. I'm sure that there will be differences in many ways as there were differences between the times of Pastor Alan Struckmeyer and Pastor Jack Mackowiak as well.

The lesson I learned from my parents and grandparents in "Good, Better, Best..." is of vital importance to me as I work here in our church. However, in order to embrace the necessary changes and thoughtfully consider the past, present, and future, I (we) must anchor ourselves in that fact that Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever (Hebrews 13:8). I keep this hope at the center of and as an anchor for my soul and as the focal point of our music ministry so that soul and ministry may be firm and secure (Hebrews 6:19). In the midst of all the change and upheaval which is always present in our church and in our world, we can remember that all of the good we have and do is a gift from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows (James 1:17).

I hope in the coming days as some of our ensembles return from the summer hiatus and others change in their own ways, that you will join us in this hope and faith. I hope that in embracing the truth of God's constancy for us, we can renew our commitment to Him and to each other and walk this narrow, rocky road together with boldness into the future. In the meantime, we can and should pray for each other. We pray that God will strengthen us in

body, mind, and spirit, and prepare us for this work that we embark upon; that God will send His spirit of Peace to us and to our families in and around the music ministry who miss us on rehearsal evenings and awaken Sunday morning to us already gone for early morning call-times; that God grant us joy in this work and that it fill us with peace, comfort, and purpose.

There will be joyful noise! There will be glorious music to the glory of God! There will be changes. There will be struggles. We will continue to “never let it rest ‘til the good get better and the better get best.” We will continue to bask in the light of the Lord who came to earth to save us. We will not become complacent, but we will continue to prepare always for the master’s return (Luke 19:11-27). May He come quickly! In the meantime, let us sing, sing, sing and pray, pray, pray!
