# Studying the Liturgy - Pastor Glover

On Sunday, October 2, we will begin a study of the liturgy during worship. That's right, we're going to study the liturgy during our Sunday morning service! I'm calling it: Liturgy Catechesis.

Each week, I will offer a brief (2-3 minute) summary of the liturgy. We'll spend a few weeks discussing what worship/the liturgy/the Divine Service is, and then we'll go portion by portion through the entire liturgy. After I give my summary of that week's portion (which will also be printed in the bulletin), I'll open it up for a question or two.

Why are we doing this? Because worship is the one time during the week when we all come together. It is the place where God's gifts of Word and Sacrament are given to you. In many ways, what we do on Sunday morning defines who and what we are as Christians more than anything else. And I want you to know why we do what we do during worship. I want you to understand what each portion of the liturgy is (the Invocation, the Introit, the Kyrie, the Gloria, etc., etc.), its history within the Church's worship, and its biblical roots. I also want you to know why I wear what I do on Sunday, why I face different ways during the service, and why the congregation stands and sits...and stands and sits...and stands and sits, throughout the service.

Bottom line, I want us to learn together. That's what catechesis is: learning. And that's what we'll do together as a congregation.

As we get ready to begin this study, I commend to you these words, written in the front of Lutheran Worship (the blue hymnal), that I think captures the essence of what worship is:

“Our Lord speaks and we listen. His Word bestows what it says. Faith that is born from what is heard acknowledges the gifts received with eager faithfulness and praise. Music is drawn into this thankfulness and praise, enlarging and elevating the adoration of our gracious giver God.

Saying back to him what he has said to us, we repeat what is most true and sure. Most true and sure is his name, which he put upon us with the water of our Baptism. We are his. This we acknowledge at the beginning of the Divine Service. Where his name is, there is he. Before him we acknowledge that we are sinners, and we plead for forgiveness. His forgiveness is given to us, and we, freed and forgiven, acclaim him as our great and gracious God as we apply to ourselves the words he has used to make himself known to us.” (Lutheran Worship, pg. 6)
