Giving Thanks - Pastor Glover

It's November, which means Thanksgiving is just around the corner. On the last Thursday of the month, Americans will once again take time to give thanks for the many blessings we have been given. I'm thankful for much, to include, among other things, my Lord, my family, and my congregation.

As I'm eating my leftover turkey sandwich on Thanksgiving night, dozing off to the 3rd or 4th football game I've watched that day, I'll try to recall the words from St. Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians that I commend to each of you:

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).

Are We Singing the Right Hymns? - Joshua Mazur

Music can be a terrific vehicle for God's Word. Knowing how important music is to so many, we take great care in selecting music and, particularly, the congregational hymns and songs to touch the hearts of as many people as possible while meeting the needs of the particular day and time of the church year, expounding and supporting the message of the appointed readings and sermon of the day as well.

Many factors—such as the denomination in which we grew up or our cultural origins—influence our hymn-type preferences. But more than any other single factor, the year we were born determines what hymns we like. We "bond" to music, both sacred and secular, between age sixteen and twenty-four.

A high percentage of American Protestants born before 1927 prefer the old gospel hymns (predominantly written between 1870 and 1935) such as "Blessed Assurance, Jesus Is Mine!" (1873); "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus" (1882); and "In the Garden" (1912). A great deal of American Protestants born from 1927 through 1945 prefer the great classic hymns (predominantly written between 1520 and 1870) like "A Mighty Fortress" (1528); "Holy, Holy, Holy" (words 1826, music 1861); and "The Church's One Foundation" (words 1866, music 1864).

Many people born since 1960 view most of the hymns in both hymn-types noted above as boring, devoid of meaning. This viewpoint appeared in the mid-1960s, as the Vietnam War began. Many adults ages 18 to 44 were developing new music preferences. As a new hymn-type arrived on the scene, the public began describing it with the following words: "non-traditional," "contemporary," "praise songs," "modern praise songs," and "praise and worship songs."

Sadly, most of the time, these "contemporary" songs get lumped together under one umbrella despite the big differences in style and content. That tragic misperception produced declines in mainline worship attendance, cultural and generational misunderstandings, and in some instances, the gradual disappearance of entire churches.

Ninety percent of Protestant congregations with non-declining worship attendance report three hymntype preferences among worshippers born since 1945. Finding names that communicate these three hymn-types to such a diverse-background group as clergy and worship leaders is difficult. The following names attempt that feat:

1st Generation Contemporary: **Modern Praise Songs**, written in the 1960-1978 era. Three examples: "They Will Know We Are Christians by Our Love" (1966); "Father, I Adore You" (1972); and "He Has Made Me Glad" (1976).

2nd Generation Contemporary: **Restorational Praise & Worship Songs**, written in the 1978-1995 era. Three examples: "I Love You Lord" (1978); "Majesty, Worship His Majesty" (1981); and "Shine Jesus Shine" (1987).

3rd Generation Contemporary: **Missional Worship Songs**, written 1995 to ca. 2008. Three examples: "Lord Reign in Me" (1998); "Here I Am to Worship" (2000); and "How Great Is Our God" (2004).

4th Generation Contemporary: **Post-Hillsong United Praise & Worship**, written from ca. 2008 to the present. Three examples: "Reckless Love" (2017), "Great Are You Lord" (2012), and "10,000 Reasons" (2011).

It is reasonable to think that adequately serving a multi-generational congregation should reflect consideration of all six hymn types. At Abiding Savior's 8:00 a.m. service, we prepare a diet consisting mostly of the **great classic hymns** and a few **old gospel hymns** with a bit of **4th Generation Contemporary** songs throughout the year. At our 10:45 a.m. service, congregants can expect at least two of the four "contemporary" hymn categories to be represented in any given week, with a slight preference towards the 2nd and 3rd generations.

As time marches forward, the needs and sensibilities of the congregation are considered and reconsidered. Current trends suggest that younger Christians (born between about 1985 and about 2008 desire more "traditional" worship expression (explaining a more traditional undertone to the songs written since about 2008). Come what may, no one is forgotten or abandoned. Abiding Savior Lutheran Church stands ready to proclaim what Jesus has done as a singing congregation today, and in the days to come!

Seeking Hearts Bible Study

Seeking Hearts Bible Study is a non-denominational study for women that meets at First Lutheran Church on Wednesday from 9:15 - 11:00 a.m. in the fellowship hall. The group will meet through the beginning of December and then resume after the holidays.

Each week, the group meets for a discussion of a lesson that is completed at home. The average homework time is about an hour/week. This time the group will be studying the book of Exodus and how "through miraculous deliverance and covenant law, the Redeemer is revealed" from the LifeChange series. The book costs about \$15 and can be purchased through Amazon. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact Bette Pring.

LERT: Hurricane Ian Cleanup

One month after Hurricane Ian struck Southwest Florida, the recovery is still taking place. Many areas of Ft. Myers, Naples, and Cape Coral are decimated. Many people have lost their homes or almost all of their possessions. Many people are also without jobs or cars (over 350,000 vehicles were flooded). But the communities are coming back more each day. Most schools are open (some shouldn't be but are). The blocks-long piles of tree and household debris are slowly being picked up (only to be replaced by more).

Our LCMS churches are working hard to help members and their communities recover. At Zion Lutheran Church basic supplies are being distributed to the community and school children. Volunteers from 10 states are helping with mucking-out flooded homes and clearing tree debris. Response operations will be open until December 3. Volunteers are still being accepted (register at www.LCMS-LERT.org).

Gift Card Fundraiser

Are you planning to give gift cards for Thanksgiving, Christmas or birthdays? How about getting gift cards for yourself? Abiding Savior has a program where you can purchase those cards. And, there's a bonus: a percentage of what you pay will be returned to the preschool in the form of a cash rebate. Read on....

<u>How does the program work?</u> You fill out an order form and return it to the Church or Preschool along with your payment.

Where are the order forms? Order forms are available in the narthex as well as in the Church and Preschool offices.

When will the orders be accepted? Orders will be accepted between Sunday, October 30, and Thursday, December 1. The completed order form and payment can be submitted on Sunday mornings or at the Church or Preschool offices during normal business hours during the week.

What about paying for the cards? Payment must be made at the time of the order with cash, a check or with a credit or debit card. Paying with a credit or debit card must be made in person—no telephone, text or email authorizations—and there will be a 3% processing reimbursement fee added to the total. There's no additional fee if paying with cash or a check.

When will the cards be available for pick up? The first group of orders will be submitted for processing on Monday, November 14, and the final group of orders before Christmas will be submitted on Friday, December 2. You'll be able to pick up the cards at the Church office or the Preschool office a few days after the orders are submitted.

<u>How does the rebate work?</u> When a card is purchased, a percent of the purchase price is automatically returned to the preschool. For example, when a \$100 card with a 5% rebate is purchased, \$5 is returned to the preschool.

<u>Is the value of the card reduced by the rebate amount?</u> **NO**. The face value of the card remains the same.

Which gift cards are available now? There are dozens of the most popular gift cards available for purchase. A list of the merchants and card values is on the next page.
