Dear ASLC Family,

As we gather together in worship, let us remember the importance of singing strongly and boldly in our praise of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Our Lutheran singing heritage is a rich and powerful tradition that has been passed down to us through generations of faithful believers.

In Hebrews 2:12, we are reminded that Jesus Himself sings praises to God in the midst of the congregation. We too are called to join in this chorus of praise, lifting our voices in unison to declare the greatness of our God. And in Psalm 71:23, we are encouraged to sing with joy and gladness, for God has saved us and redeemed us from the depths of sin and death.

Our Lutheran hymns and chorales are a treasure trove of theological richness and spiritual depth. Through them, we are able to express our faith and devotion to God in a way that is both profound and heartfelt. Let us sing with all our hearts, minds, and souls, for it is through our singing that we offer our praise and worship to the God who created us, redeemed us, and sustains us each and every day.

May the Holy Spirit guide and inspire us as we lift our voices in worship and praise, and may our singing bring glory and honor to God now and forevermore. Amen.
