# The Cross - Pastor Glover

On Thursday, September 14, at 11:00 a.m., we will have a service (Matins) to celebrate Holy Cross Day.

One of the earliest annual celebrations of the Church, Holy Cross Day traditionally commemorated the discovery of the original cross of Jesus on September 14, 320, in Jerusalem. The cross was found by Helena, the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine the Great. (Helena was a devout Christian who helped locate and authenticate many sites related to the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus in biblical lands.)

In conjunction with the dedication of a basilica at the site of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, this festival day was made official by order of Constantine in 335.

But why do Lutherans continue to set aside a day to celebrate a thing?

As my friend, Rev. Dr. John Bombaro said: "All too often the Cross is relegated to one small area of Christian doctrine. But the Cross stamps an indelible and decisive impression upon every facet of the Christian faith...It directs our ecclesiology, our vocations, our sanctification, our ethics, our families, you name it." In other words, the cross directs everything about our Christian faith.

Rev. Bombaro continues: "The criterion of what is Christian and what is not is the holy Cross of Jesus Christ, the crucial enigma which distinguishes the peculiar Christian way of understanding human existence and experience from all other viewpoints. Therefore, the point of reference for deciding which theological statements are Christian and which are not is "given" to us in the crucified Christ. Christian belief and practice are based upon it and judged by it. Holy Cross Day has stood as a monument and touchstone for nearly eighteen centuries so our generation too may confess: "Christ and Him crucified."

In other words, we continue to celebrate Holy Cross Day because in the cross we find redemption. We find salvation. We find our Lord.

In every way, the cross is everything. So come and celebrate with us on the 14th!

## *Understanding “Hymns”, and their associated “Tunes”*

We spend a whole lot of time in worship singing. The songs we sing are rich in history, theology, and musical artistry. However, the terms related to these songs can sometimes be confusing. To help clarify, let's dive into all this “stuff” and define some of the words we often use to describe our music in worship.

When I use the word Hymn, I'm really talking about the text; the actual words that we sing. Some hymn texts have, over time, become strongly associated with a particular Tune, but more often than not, different and unrelated people, at different times and in different locations wrote the text and the melody.

For example, the text of “Amazing Grace” was written by English Anglican clergyman and poet John Newton in 1779. At the time, it is thought that the text was chanted by the congregation, and it has been found in many hymnals in the meantime with more than twenty different tunes. However, in 1835, American composer William Walker “set” the text to a new tune called NEW BRITAIN, which became very popular and is the version most frequently sung today. Names of hymn tunes are always written in all capital letters, to set it apart from the name of the hymn text.

At the bottom of each page of the hymnal, you can see more information about the hymn including the author of the text, composer of the tune, the name of the tune, and a special number that tells you how many syllables are in each line that make up the text's Meter. This would allow you to sing any particular text with a compatible hymn tune.

Amazing Grace, for instance, has a meter of 8.6.8.6 – Each stanza is four lines long, which is why there are four numbers. Line one has 8 syllables, the second 6, and so on. NEW BRITAIN has a meter of 8.6.8.6 as well, but there are other tunes. Try singing Amazing Grace to the tune CORONATION, which is the tune most of us associate with “All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name”, or to ST. ANNE, the tune most of us associate with “O God, Our Help in Ages Past.”

This is a very useful tool for the Director of Music Ministry who may choose an alternate tune to highlight different aspects of the text. (It is also very helpful to the singing of a rarely sung hymn text if it can be sung to a familiar hymn tune!) The traditional melody for Amazing Grace is heartfelt and classic but what if we wanted to sing the text in triumph and fanfare? Try CORONATION or ST. ANNE. By the way, if you want to drive people crazy, you can also sing Amazing Grace to the tune of the theme song from “Gilligan's Island” or “The House of the Rising Sun.” Seriously. Give it a go!

Please consider being on the Altar Care Team! It involves one month of duty every 5 months. You would be on a team of 4 or 5 ladies. This ensures that if one or two members have a schedule conflict, the others can cover. We are very flexible! (Some of our members can only help on Sunday and some help on a substitute basis.)

The monthly team usually meets on Saturday morning to set up. Some early service team members restock the altar between services, then late service team members put things away. ## Called to Serve

What a gift we have in our salvation, given to us by the sacrifice of God's only son through which we have eternal life with Him forever! It truly is a gift; there was nothing we had to do to receive it. We get to wake up each day without fear that we will lose that gift. What a blessing! Though it has been a little over a month since I returned from my time in Peru, I cannot help but think often about the people there who live without the hope that we have in Jesus Christ. Children and adults alike, living in fear of the night and the terror it brings because they have put their faith in spirits of the jungle rather than the King of Kings. Not that they would know any better, necessarily. It is estimated that there are currently around 20 uncontacted native tribes in Peru, living in the most remote, un navigated regions of the Amazon rainforest. In Matthew, we are charged with the responsibility to make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matt. 28:16-20). What an incredible responsibility we have been given! Currently, there is much work being done in Peru to train up Pastors to plant churches in far reaching parts of the rainforest, and efforts are being made to reach the uncontacted. It's easy for us to sit and think, how can I, one tiny person, make a difference and obey the commission Jesus gave to his disciples? Does God expect me to go out and mow a path through the jungle to reach an uncontacted tribe? Of course not! We as the church body all have different roles to play in the spreading of the Good News. Missionaries across the world have taken a hands-on approach to fulfilling

this command. We as the church body can support them in their efforts through prayer and financial support.

What is my place in all of this? What is Abiding Savior's place in all of this? These are questions I've been asking myself since I returned, and I think these are questions we can continue to ask. More to come on this topic later.
