### The Gift of Christmas - Pastor Glover

"Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us). When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife, but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus." (Matthew 1:18-25)

Our family opens presents on Christmas morning. One of the things I miss about this ritual in our household is that nobody asks for toys as gifts anymore. Our kids are older teenagers and their preferences for gifts aren't what they were when they were younger. So, no more superhero action figures, no more American Girl dolls, no more Legos, and no more random toys that were always so much fun to play with during the Christmas holiday.

I know, I know, Christmas isn't about toys. Nor is it about exchanging gifts or fond family rituals. But this doesn't mean there's anything wrong with giving or receiving gifts, looking forward to those family rituals, or even enjoying playing with a fun toy (regardless of your age!). So, keep doing those things and rejoice in the Lord while doing them! (And maybe for good measure, I'll just go ahead and buy some toys for my kids anyway this year!)

But we are all wise to remember that Christmas is about THE gift. As you know, it's about the greatest gift ever given: the birth of the promised Messiah. And this is the gift that keeps on giving!

It's the gift that brings families together. It's the gift that brings smiles to faces. It's the gift that makes this one of the greatest holy days of the year. It's the gift of Jesus.

Born to the Virgin Mary, this gift brings peace to the world. This gift brings forgiveness. This brings eternal life.

My prayer is that each of us rejoices in this gift. For it is the gift that makes everything else possible.

## Harmonizing the Season of Advent Music That Guides Our Hearts - Joshua Mazur

O Jesus Christ,

Thy manger is the paradise at which my soul reclineth. For there, O Lord, Doth lie the Word Made flesh for us; herein Thy grace forthshineth.

Dear Members of Abiding Savior Lutheran Church & School,

As we gather at the threshold of another Advent season, I am filled with joy and anticipation to journey together through this penitential period of reflection, preparation, and hope. Advent, which means "coming" or "arrival," beckons us to delve deep into the mystery of Christ's incarnation and to eagerly await His return in glory. It is a season marked by repentance, watchfulness, and joyful expectation.

Music has a profound way of touching our souls and stirring our hearts, and during Advent, it plays a vital role in guiding us towards the profound message of this sacred time. Whether it's sung by our mostly-classically-trained choir, played on the organ or piano, or presented by our beautiful folk-band of a praise team, all of the music we present here is not for mere entertainment; the music of Advent powerfully proclaims Gods Word in a way that continually reminds us of the three-fold message: "Jesus came, Jesus comes, Jesus will come again."

Thou Christian heart, Whoe'er thou art, Be of good cheer and let no sorrow move thee! For God's own Child, In mercy mild, Joins thee to Him;-how greatly God must love thee!

#### 1. Reflecting on Christ's Incarnation:

Advent begins with a focus on the past—the historical event of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem. The hauntingly beautiful hymns and carols of Advent, such as "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" and "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming," transport us back in time to that holy night when the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. As we sing these melodies, let us remember that Jesus came as a humble infant, born of the Virgin Mary, to bring salvation and light into a world in need of hope. Our music should evoke feelings of awe and gratitude for this great gift.

### 2. Embracing the Present:

Advent also reminds us of the present reality of Christ's presence in our lives. Through the Holy Spirit, He dwells within our hearts, guiding and transforming us. Songs like "Come, Holy Ghost, God, and Lord" and "Spirit of God, Descend upon My Heart" emphasize the

ongoing work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. These hymns invite us to open our hearts to the Spirit's leading, allowing Him to prepare us for the daily encounters with Christ.

### 3. Anticipating His Glorious Return:

The final aspect of Advent calls us to look to the future with hope and anticipation. We await the second coming of Christ when He will return in glory to judge the living and the dead. Songs like "Wake, Awake, for Night Is Flying" and "Lo, He Comes with Clouds Descending" remind us of the need to be vigilant and prepared for that momentous day. Our music should stir our hearts to live in constant expectation of Christ's return, motivating us to keep His Word and follow His commandments in our daily lives.

In our musical selections for Advent, we will aim to balance all three aspects of this season. The choir will travel, musically, to convents in the Black Forest of Germany with music by Hildegarde von Bingen (written between 1075 and 1145) for our Advent Choral Evensong, and you'll hear all of the music ministry in modern – and sometimes secular – music at the Christmas Dinner on the 17th, alongside traditional carols during the Youth's play. The Praise Team will present beloved Lutheran texts in new musical settings befitting the Folk-Gospel stylings they are so very good at.

The music ministry is always striving for excellence and reaffirming our commitment to singing and playing with full understanding that we are not mere decorations for "Worship Services," but active and faithful proclaimers and confessors of the faith in God's Divine Service. Join us as we embark on this Advent journey, and let us allow the music that haloes the full and perfect Word of God to draw us closer to Christ—past, present, and future. Let it serve as a reminder of the incredible love and grace God has poured out upon us through His Son, as well as a catalyst for a deeper, more expectant faith.

The world may hold Her wealth and gold;
But thou, my heart, keep Christ as thy true Treasure.
To Him hold fast Until at last
A crown be thine and honor in full measure.

May our hearts be open, our spirits be attuned, and our voices raised in joyful anticipation as we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Savior and await His glorious return.
