

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. Philippians 1:2-6 (NIV)

The Apostle Paul began his letter to the Church in Philippi by sharing how thankful he was for that group of Christians. As with all of his letters, Paul continued by offering instructions on how to be followers of Christ and how to be the Church in their city and Roman province.

I would like to echo Paul's words as the way Debbie and I feel about our church family here at Beach United Methodist Church. We have been partners in the Gospel (the good news of Jesus Christ) for 10 months now, and it has been our privilege. Being here this long means that we have experienced the cycles of our congregation from our summer worship attendance in the Fellowship Hall where even our four footed friends are welcome to our nearly full house at the peak of our winter season in the months of January through March. We have had a chance to get to know many of you both year round and seasonal folks and look forward to getting to know more of you when you return again next season.

In the meantime, we will be working hard over the next few months to identify what God's vision is for our church and community, initiating new ministries for our members and constituents as well as our community at large and engaging in more and more relationship-building. I am contemplating starting a Wednesday night beach Bible study at the end of the beach access right across from the church. I will be working with our leadership to help them get out into the community at large to start asking the question: "What is missing in our community the Beach UMC could help provide?" Statistically there are as many or more people not attending church or religious services than are. How do we reach the formally churched and unchurched people in our community? This would be in addition to what we already do as a church. We will also look at building upon our relationship with Beach Elementary School and finding out what more we can do to be of service to our neighbors.







many of you in the congregation as well as people in the community. It has been a year of observing and learning the rhythms of life unique to this community and people who call Fort Myers Beach home for however long they (you) live here. My year has also included working at Fort Myers Beach Elementary, which has provided its own unique perspective into the lives of people in this community.

Over this year our congregation has partnered with the school in ways to support both the staff and students. We have been supportive through praying for individual faculty and staff members, we have provided encouraging notes and treats to the staff on a quarterly basis, and we have collected school supplies to support the students. Our August and September Second Mile Giving was designated to support both Fort Myers Beach Elementary and the GLAD Kids Early Learning Center (in Fort Myers). These funds were made available to help defray some of the costs that teachers end up taking on as they provide so much out of their own pockets to provide for their students. On behalf of the students and staff, thank you for caring and sharing.

A Church/School Partnership is a great way to learn about needs in the community. I have been involved in many schools throughout my own children's growing up years and then as a volunteer in the schools in the communities where our church appointments have been. Schools are increasingly becoming more than places of education. They are also having to provide social services to children from dysfunctional families, safe spaces for children who are lacking structured

and loving home lives, assisting families who are homeless or living in poverty, and dealing with emotional trauma that many of the children are experiencing. I expected this to some degree, but I have been surprised by the number of children (even at our small island school) who deal with a home life that nobody should have to experience.

As we look ahead to the next year of ministry in the community, let us explore ways that the church can further positively impact the community through the Church/School partnership. What can we do as a church to make a difference in the lives of these children and their families, and by extension, to other people on the island. Could it involve mentoring or tutoring, partnering with the recreation department for after school activities, or volunteering a couple of hours a week in a classroom? Could we be a place for grief support, not only for adults in the community, but for children who have also experienced major losses of all kinds? How can we cooperate with and bolster the work of other community organizations here on the island in these endeavors?

Over the next months and year we can 1) pray for open hearts, minds, and direction from God, 2) explore new ways to expand ministry with the community, 3) continue with our collection of school supplies and 4) have special Sundays like Undie Sunday, to collect underwear and socks. Watch for more information about possible dates in the fall and spring. We look forward to ways we can be the hands and feet of Christ on Fort Myers Beach.
