#### **WELCOME TO WORSHIP**

#### TRUE WORSHIP

**True worship** is more than the speaking or singing of words from a printed page. It takes place in the heart of each believer as we hear the Bible read, explained, and applied to our lives, and as we respond in grateful adoration to God for His great love and mercy in Jesus Christ. It is helpful to arrive early to look over the service and to spend time in prayer. While worship may take various forms, the use of standardized orders of worship ("liturgies") dates back to the early Church, as a means of reinforcing Biblical beliefs and actively involving the congregation in worship.

#### THE SACRAMENT (2ND AND LAST SUNDAY)

In this Sacrament, Christ not only gives us bread and wine, but His holy body and blood, for the forgiveness of those who believe this (Matthew 26:26-28), but to the judgment of those who do not so believe. (1 Corinthians 11:27-31). Nothing is more sacred. Scripture requires that Pastors, as "stewards of the mysteries of Christ" (1 Corinthians 4:1), commune only those who are spiritually prepared and in full doctrinal agreement. (1 Corinthians 10:16-17, Romans 10:17, Hebrews 13:17, James 3:1, 1 Timothy 4:11-16, 2 Timothy 4:1-5). We therefore ask that you please speak with the pastor before you receive the Lord's Supper at Beautiful Savior for the first time. Thank you.

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## SERIES THEME UNCOVERED


We are in the season of the Church called Epiphany, a Greek word that means "to appear." Salvation has appeared in the person of Jesus Christ. In Epiphany, the Church explores everything that Christ makes apparent about God. You see, we need God to appear to us and make himself known to us. For not only is God beyond our understanding, his works and his ways are contrary to mankind's natural assumptions about him. In other words, the truth about God cannot possibly be discovered by us. Rather, it needs to be uncovered for us. That's what the Spirit is doing for us during this season of Epiphany. Week after week, surprising truths about Jesus our King and life in his kingdom will be uncovered.

#### THEME OF THE DAY

#### DELIGHT UNCOVERED: GOD DELIVERS MORE THAN WE ASK, NOT LESS

Is the pursuit of God and the pursuit of pleasure two separate paths? Many make that assumption—that life with Jesus is a boring, sterile experience. They are dead wrong. Jesus came to undo everything that is wrong with our world as a result of sin's curse. He also came to multiply our joy and deliver delight beyond our wildest dreams. Note that when Jesus begins to reveal his glory, it isn't by going to a hospital to cure every ailment. Instead, he starts at a local wedding, one of the greatest sources of joy in this life. The truth uncovered for us this week is that life with Jesus is not a life with less delight, but infinitely more.

#### THE GOSPEL: John 2:1-11 (NIV84)

M: The Holy Gospel is written in the 2nd chapter of John, beginning at the 1st verse

On the third day a wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, 2 and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. 3 When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no more wine." 4 "Dear woman, why do you involve me?" Jesus replied. "My time has not yet come." 5 His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." 6 Nearby stood six stone water jars, the kind used by the Jews for ceremonial washing, each holding from twenty to thirty gallons. 7 Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water"; so they filled them to the brim. 8 Then he told them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet." They did so, 9 and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though

the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside 10 and said, "Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now." 11 This, the first of his miraculous signs, Jesus performed at Cana in Galilee. He thus revealed his glory, and his disciples put their faith in him.

**M:** This is the Holy Gospel of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

# God's Word for This Week:

#### Jesus Is Our Miraculous Savior

In today's Gospel, Jesus performs his first miracle: He turns 120 gallons of water into wine. Jesus doesn't touch the water. It's no trick. It's a real miracle. He does it because the Father now wants him to go "public" and reveal his glory. As a result, his disciples trust in him as the Son of God.

#### First Lesson – Isaiah 62:1-5

- ♦ Who is speaking in these verses through the prophet Isaiah? For instance, who's the "I" of verse one?
- ♦ For whose sake would Jesus do what he did as our Savior?
- ♦ What is the result of Jesus' gracious work for his people?

#### Second Lesson – Ephesians 3:14-21

- ♦ Jesus came to visit a wedding in Cana. What does Paul pray for the Christians in Ephesus, by contrast? (See 3:17.)
- ♦ Nobody knew how Jesus turned water into wine. Likewise, what does Paul want Christians to know? (See 3:19.)
- ♦ How much is God able to do? (See 3:20-21.)

#### Gospel – John 2:1-11

- ♦ What problem arose at the wedding in Cana to which Jesus and his disciples were invited?
- ♦ How did Jesus react when Mary told him that they had run out of wine? Why did he react this way?
- ♦ What did Jesus do to resolve the problem? 14

#### God's Word for This Week: Answers from last Sunday

#### First Lesson - 1 Samuel 16:1-13

#### Whom had God rejected as the King of Israel?

God had rejected Saul.

## When Samuel went to anoint a new king, did he and the Lord agree on who would be the "perfect" king?

They did not agree. Samuel was impressed with the oldest sons of Jesse because they were big and handsome. But the Lord had different ideas, as he explained: "The LORD does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."

#### Whom did the Lord finally choose as Israel's new king?

God chose the youngest son of Jesse—David—the forefather of our perfect Savior, Jesus. Jesus, too, would seem like an unlikely choice to be our perfect Savior (cf. Isaiah 53:2-3).

#### Second Lesson – Titus 3:4-7

#### According to St. Paul, why did God save us?

Paul plainly states that God did not save us because of righteous things we had done (our good works) but because of his mercy. In other words, our salvation depends entirely upon God's love for us and not our love for him, a concept that seems unlikely to human reason.

#### According to St. Paul, how did God save us?

Paul explains that God saved us "through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit." The Christian church has always understood this to be a reference to Holy Baptism, where God washes away our sin through this water connected to his Word of promise.

#### Gospel – Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

#### What was the purpose of the baptism given by John?

The purpose was the same as the baptism we have today: it was "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" (Mark 1:4).

#### If Jesus was sinless, why was he baptized?

In Jesus' baptism, God commissioned him to "go public" and save us, and the Father anointed him with the Holy Spirit and power (Acts 10:38). Also, though Jesus did not have any personal sin, Jesus was not aloof. In his role as Savior, he carried the world's guilt. He had come to be our perfect substitute and to identify with every sinner.

#### Which three special persons were present at the baptism of Jesus?

The Father spoke from above and sent the Spirit to the Son. Likewise, we were baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). We are all sons of God by faith in Christ Jesus (Galatians 3:26).

# CENTRAL AFRICA MEDICAL MISSION January 2022

## **Greetings and a Happy New Year!**

I am Lusungu Mwambeye, the clinic administrator-in-training taking over from Gary Evans at the Lutheran Mobile Clinic (LMC). I hold a Bachelor of Science degree in public health, and I am currently pursuing master's degree in healthcare systems management. I am a Christian from St. Peters Lutheran church in Lilongwe, Malawi.



In 2022, after 52 years of operating in Malawi, CAMM will turn the day-to-day management of LMC to Malawian nationals. As a result, LMC hired myself as the clinic administrator in training and Violet Chikwatu as Nurse in charge in training to take over when Gary and Beth Evans, the current administrator and nurse in charge respectively, leave Malawi in June 2022.

As an administrator in training for Lutheran Mobile Clinic, I am so humbled and delighted for this opportunity and being part of the team that is doing great things in terms of reaching out to the people in the hard-to-reach areas in the central region of Malawi with healthcare and spiritual guidance. Malawi is one of the poorest countries in the world which affects its' ability to deliver quality health care. Most residents reside in the remote areas where they face many challenges in accessing any kind of healthcare service - government or private, and even when they do find a facility, most government hospitals do not have drugs. It's sad and challenging for most Malawians who live below the poverty line and cannot afford to pay for drugs in the private hospitals.

With the help from you, our brothers and sisters in Christ, LMC reaches out to thousands of people with affordable medical treatment and preventive health services. Our Christian staff gives care that patients fail to find in the government hospitals. They also have access to quality water through the boreholes LMC brought to the clinics, and food supplements for malnourished children and orphans. Our staff includes health education daily, with topics such as hygiene, nutrition, prevention of Covid-19 and other infectious diseases, hypertension, malaria, and prenatal care.

As the rains finally come to Malawi, farmers are working hard in the fields, planting their various crops, mainly maize, or corn as it is known in America. This is used to make flour for Nsima which is a staple food and eaten with a relish (Ndiwo) of meat or vegetables. In some areas, mostly near the lakeshore, farmers go for rice and cassava as their most grown crop. We are hoping the government distributes a lot of coupons for fertilizer subsidy to the farmers as the fertilizer prices have gone up which will risk most farmers not applying fertilizer if they miss the subsidy. This will risk low crop yields and food insecurity. We pray for the right amount of rain to water the crops, since it started late this year. A good thunderstorm helped welcome in

the new year in Lilongwe and it was an answered prayer.

We are very thankful for your continued support for Lutheran Mobile Clinic. I pray that through God's grace and your support, our clinic will continue to provide both spiritual and physical care to every patient that comes to our four clinic sites. Join me in praying that the Lord continues to bless LMC with dedicated and professional staff, and provides continued safety for our patients, our staff, and our supporters in America.

May the Lord bless you and keep you well in these trying times where Covid-19 has and is roaring globally. May the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you.


