Pastor's Corner

Be Blessed + Believe + Belong!



Everyone likes a party. This Sunday is another important day in the Church calendar. I know we've been hitting a lot of them lately, but things quiet down over the summer months, so this is one of the last few "big" Sundays. The special day we observe on Sunday is called "Pentecost." The word Pentecost is from Greek and simply means "Fiftieth." It is the 50th day after Passover. For us as Christians, Passover has been fulfilled in a greater way through Easter (1 Cor. 5:7) and so we usually refer to Pentecost as the 50th day after Easter (counting Easter as day 1), not Passover.

Pentecost is a Festival that has a long history. It is one of the three festivals that God commanded the Israelites to observe every year (see Exo. 23:14-17). In that context, Pentecost was called the Feast of Harvest and it occurred as the first crops of the growing season gave their fruit, thus it was also called First-fruits.

But Jesus transformed this festival into more than an agricultural festival. It turned into a Spiritual celebration. As the story is told in Acts 1:1-11 (which we will read in church on Sunday), . It is the story of how the Holy Spirit comes on the first apostles and they are given the ability to speak in other languages so that all the people who are gathered.

Pentecost isn't the first time the Holy Spirit had come (remember for instance that Jesus gave the Holy Spirit to the disciples on Easter (John 20:22)), but the Holy Spirit gave new gifts to these believers and the power given was the power to proclaim the Gospel to all of those visitors who had come to Jerusalem for the Pentecost festival.

Little did those people who had come to Jerusalem know that the real first-fruits celebration was the first-fruits of the fulfillment of Jesus' promise that the Gospel must be proclaimed to all nations, beginning first at Jerusalem (Luke 24:47). But now they were part of something new. The Kingdom of God which had come through Jesus now came to them through the words of Peter and the others. They too received the Holy Spirit through the waters of Baptism (Acts 2:38). But this promise of salvation wasn't just for the people gathered at the Festival that day.

All those people returned to their homes, all over the world, and told others about this new way that God had worked a salvation for all people, that Jesus had ascended into heaven, and one day they too would be there with him. First Jesus, but soon all believers would follow Him.

And now these followers of Jesus are sharing in a heavenly party with a heavenly promise. Salvation, forgiveness of sins, the Holy Spirit. These gifts aren't just for them. They're for their children and grandchildren and great-grandchildren too. They're for the whole world. These 3,000 who believed, they might have been among the first to hear this news about what Jesus had done, but they are not the last. We're part of this group too. So let's celebrate and rejoice in the work of the Holy Spirit in us too. After all, everyone likes a party.

Lessons Learned from The Screwtape Letters

For some weeks now, some Bethany folks (and some guests) have been doing a Bible study based on *The Screwtape Letters* by C.S. Lewis. The book is a study of temptation and of human nature told from an upside-down perspective. Screwtape is a Senior Tempter in the Lowerarchy of Hell which is portrayed as a dreary, endless bureaucracy. He is giving advice to his nephew, Wormwood, a Junior Tempter who has just been assigned his first "patient." Thus the advice that Screwtape gives is designed to corrupt and condemn the "patient." Some folks have been troubled by this negative literary device, so we have set ourselves to restate the lessons that we have learned in a positive format. Here is the next installment:

- Praying from the heart without words can be a powerful benefit; it goes beyond the "devotional mood."
- Since "all mortal tend to turn into the thing they are pretending to be," try pretending to be a better Christian.
- ➤ If I insist things are "mine," that implies that I am the creator which is incorrect is wrong! I am the recipient of God's grace.
- We must strengthen in ourselves the habit of attending to universal issues and withdraw our attention from the immediate stream of sensory experiences.
- ▶ We need always to remember that we are strangers here and that heaven is our home.
- > We need to pray as we are commanded to pray and then leave the results to God.
