# Pastor's Corner

Be Blessed + Believe + Belong!



This week marks the culmination of the church season known as Lent, in which we have found ourselves for the past 6 weeks. The week is often referred to as Holy Week and it is filled with a lot of action.

The week begins on Sunday with **Palm Sunday**, when Jesus enters into Jerusalem and is triumphantly hailed as King, but He doesn't use this entrance as an opportunity to elevate Himself. Instead, He continues to go about His business, following His Father's timeline, not the people's.

This week during Lent, we also have worship services on Thursday and Friday. Those services are referred to as Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, both of which are weirdly named.

**Maundy Thursday** is so named from the new commandment Jesus gives His disciples to love one another, just as He has loved them (John 13:34). The word "Maundy" is related through Latin (*mandatum*) to the word commandment. Jesus' love for His disciples is also shown in Him instituting what we called the Lord's Supper, fulfilling in a much greater way the Passover feast in which the shedding of the blood of the lamb saves God's people.

**Good Friday** is a misnomer if you misunderstand the signifiance of the day. It is the day our Lord dies on the cross. That alone should mean it's the worst day imaginable. If a loved one dies, it's not a good day, so how much more when it is our innocent Savior? The reason we call it Good Friday is explained extremely well in this famous comic B.C. by Johnny Hart.



If you're not able to make those services, the Easter story is always going to be lacking a little bit of its true meaning. So please try to make it to worship or watch online. If you can't do that, this is a great week to read the Passion accounts in the Bible too. You can find it in all of the Gospels: Matthew 26:30-27-6, Mark 14:26-15:47, Luke 22:39-23:56, and John 18:1-19:42.

It is my hope that you are able to find time, whether in worship or in your own quiet time this week to humbly reflect on your own personal need for a Savior and then to stand in awe of Jesus' deep love for you. For He has done all that was needed, all that we could not or would not do to give us His life forever.

#### K-8 Sunday School Activities for Palm Sunday and Easter!

**Palm Sunday:** From B.L.C. archives, we'll use a set of rustic banners made to signify 14 Bible events from the Last Supper to the Crucifixion—Jesus' Passion—to show our Savior's sacrificial love for us! Then the children will assemble their own Resurrection banners proclaiming Joy in Jesus' victory for our salvation! Those banners will be displayed at church through Easter Sunday.

**On Easter**, Sunday School will have a prepped-and-supervised TREASURE HUNT with hidden CLUES based on Messianic prophecies in the Bible! All children will search for each clue. Visiting kids are welcome to participate. Clues will be freshly hidden in Narthex, Sanctuary, and Outside in the area close to the main church entry. Monitors will watch. Procedure: Breakfast will be on-going in the Fellowship Hall. At about 9:45, Treasure Hunt participants will be called to assemble for instructions in the Sunday School room. ## **The Lutheran Witness**

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod publishes a monthly magazine (though only 11 issues/year) called "The Lutheran Witness." One or two articles per month are usually freely avaiable online, but all other content requires a subscription. Subscriptions (for paper + online access) can be purchased any time through Concordia Publishing House for \$24.99/year, but Bethany members can also purchase subscriptions through a group buying plan for \$21.50/year. The catch is the window for subscribing through the church only opens once a year. If you wish to subscribe through this group plan, **the deadline is April 14**th to get money to the church. If you wish to do this, you can do it through the



Sunday offering, just make sure that the check/money is labelled with your name, the amount (\$20) and "Lutheran Witness" subscription. If you have any questions, let us know in the office.

#### **Lutheran LIFE**

The Florida-Georgia District of the LCMS also publishes their own periodical called "Lutheran LIFE" and also offers **FREE** subscriptions to all church members. This is a great way to see what else is happening in Florida-Georgia churches/schools. #### **Notes From Our Members**

It has been a rocky road for Philip these last 6 months or so... but it is wonderful that he passed his last test this week and is good to go! To catch you all up to date - Phil had a bacterial infection on his artificial aortic heart valve that was not diagnosed until the end of December. For several months he had been battling ailments that included ER visits and hospitalizations. Balance was a big issue and at one point in October he had a fall causing a small brain bleed. With the final diagnosis he was placed on antibiotic IVs while in the hospital for 9 days. Upon returning home he had a PICC line for 5 more weeks of liquid antibiotic that sprayed the heart area. Depending on the outcome it could mean continued liquid antibiotics, open heart surgery, or antibiotics for the rest of his life. A month ago, he had an esophageal echo done that showed all of the vegetation that was harboring the bacteria on the valve was gone and there was no damage to his heart or valve. That meant no surgery! Since then, we have had 10 or so doctor's visits with each one of them declaring he is doing well! We have been cleared for no doctor visits for 6 months!

We are so thankful to God for bringing us through this challenging time! For my mom being a rock and as she looks forward to 90 in April is generally healthy! For the members of Bethany who kept us in their prayers! We would not be here without the love, support, prayers, and the mercy of God through Jesus Christ!

Phil is now allowed to travel, and we are taking off for a quick trip to Maine to celebrate our granddaughter's 2nd birthday this Friday! We will see you all soon! Karen & Phil

#### DON'T STOP - THEY ARE WORKING!

After two more weeks of healing, I met with the "top" orthopedic surgeon for the first time. He asked me what my number one question is. I told him that I can't stand this pesky sling. He said that a sling is worn only for comfort, has nothing to do with healing. So, I can decide when to wear it. (that would be never).

Hallelujah, the power of prayer.....Doctor said Roter cup is out of socket, but impacted against the wall, keeping it from falling down. He was surprised, as that rarely happens. WE know that the Prayers did that, a miracle.

I go back on April 15th, so let's surprise the doctor again. Pray that I can move my left arm in all kinds of directions, pain free and that the circulation in my left shoulder will remain positive.

For people my age with this kind of fracture, doctors say it will be up to two years for healing and pain to be gone. I hope to be past that on my next visit.

As soon as I can be independent again, I will return to my home and Pastor Hanel and my Bethany family, whom I miss so very much.

May the good Lord bless ALL of you and keep you in His care.
