Pastor's Corner

Be Blessed + Believe + Belong!



This week in the city of New Orleans thousands of high school age youth from across the country will be filling up the Superdome for the LCMS National Youth Gathering, which is held every three years. Three years ago I attended with a couple of our youth with the group from Faith Lutheran in Eustis. My wife also attended as a helper for the emergency helpline. This year none of the youth of our congregation are attending but my wife is attending as the co-District Coordinator for the Florida-Georgia District. (So if I seem a bit distract this week, it's because I'm holding down the fort at home by myself for a few days!)

The theme of the Youth Gathering is ENDURE and it's based on Hebrews 12:1-3: Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted.

The theme is relevant for youth who are living through major life-changes as they navigate that path between childhood and adulthood and try to understand who they are as they face a myriad of choices. Youth are resilient but they face a lot of times where they might feel alone or that they're incapable of making the next move or that they're ready to give up.

None of us can really endure on our own though. To think about endurance means to think about something that lasts. It's more than perseverance and it's about thinking what makes it to the end. These words from Hebrews affirm that it is Jesus who first *end*ured. He lived His life to the end. But the cross wasn't truly the end for Jesus, He overcame sin, death, and Satan and now is seated at the right hand of God the Father and rules all things. He is the eternal king and He is the end of our story too. His love endurs forever. His mercy endures forever. His Word endures forever.

We all experience great trials and sufferings in this life, but we cannot and do not do this alone. Through our Savior's help, we endure (persevere) in these earthly trials, because we have an enduring (eternal) life that points us to hope. Our end is always in and with Jesus who overcame all things for us!

The school was 2 percentage points from an A grade.


In 2017 the school was the only F school in Lake County.

At Home Caring Giving Resources

"I love you." Words we say often, even when we are struggling to care for the ones we love. Recently, I was asked by a member of the church what I thought about some assisted living places and options for a loved one, as health, whether physical or cognitive, continues to progress in a direction that takes us on a journey we hoped not to take. It is never an easy life event.

Increasingly, families are striving to keep their loved ones close, enabling them to live at home for as long as possible. I know this life all too well, caring for my 91-year-old mother who has been in a wheelchair for 20-plus years. It's like juggling balls constantly; sometimes some of the balls go away, and it's a simple one/two, easy-going. Other times, it is like someone keeps tossing the balls into the circle that you are juggling, and you wonder when they will all fall. That is the time when you need help. Needing help is okay. It is about balance, sleep, grace, and sometimes releasing the pressure valve. But where do you turn to? Family, friends, someone you read about in the paper, or a caregiving service? The responsibility of a loved one in need of "care" versus the loving relationship we are committed to can be overwhelming. Sometimes their ability to communicate their needs declines, becomes confused, or flustered as they try to tell you. Other times, it may become demanding, rude, or disruptive. Things that may be entirely out of their nature. The reality is that the feelings of being overwhelmed, insecure, unsafe, or not being heard may be at the root of these needs.

Whether you call it a crisis, a major change in life, or a decline in health, there are many hard facts to look at to ensure the caregiver and the care receiver are equipped with the essentials for relief and help. Prognosis, communication, acceptance, and understanding the duration of care needed, as well as financial expenses, can lead to uncomfortable conversations with family and friends. Being the spouse means a lifetime of commitment and love. Remember that when you make those hard decisions and choices regarding care, it is love when you are providing safety, comfort, and care for both spouses and family members.

The cost of assisted living and nursing homes can be astronomical. Family and friends can help. This is a wonderful time to give to someone who has given so much to you over the years. Reality sets in quickly when you are choosing to "give up" or "change up" parts of your life for weeks, months, years, or more. That is why balancing becomes part of the plan. The word 'burden' is out of the vocabulary, as it changes the direction of the journey. This is about love, safety, and the ability to be in your own home.

Faithfully yours means caring for yourself while caring for others. In this article, we discuss how to obtain the assistance you need in your own home. That is a major step in caring for yourself.

Hiring someone: This is tricky if you are hiring someone who is not connected with an agency. If you know and trust someone, that is great. Hire them! It makes the transaction easy. However, there are times when we see posts about someone looking for a caregiving position who wants an easy paycheck. They may even have some excellent references. In today's world, you have to be so very careful of fakes. Fakes are

individuals who seek to take advantage of you. Here are some things to think about before hiring someone for cash, under the table, or not licensed:

- 1. If your family becomes combative, there is a chance you could be liable for medical expenses, and God forbid, the "employee" decides to press charges of assault. Yes, that does happen.
- 2. If the helper becomes hurt while on your property, does your insurance cover them if you are paying for caregiving services?
- 3. What about IRS rules regarding household employees? 1099s? And all kinds of other stuff?
- 4. Not to discount the trust you instill in that person, may show up as neglect, abuse, or theft.

I know I am playing the "devil's advocate" as to what can go wrong. There are some wonderful people out there. Phil and I have both helped with providing care. However, when you are stressed, in need, and starting to get overwhelmed, that is when red flags can be missed. I want you all to be safe. Here are the reasons why using a service answers those questions above.

- 1. As an employee of a company providing the service, they are trained to deal with all kinds of service needs, including how to de-escalate a situation when fear, anger, or other emotions can become combative.
- 2. If the employee becomes injured, the employer pays for workman's comp, which pays for those injuries and the legal issues.
- 3. The employer pays for all the tax withholdings and reporting of income.
- 4. Background checks, training, interviews, and case management all reduce the chance of neglect, abuse, or theft. If something does happen, you have someone to go to who can hold that person responsible.
