The Pastor's Page

March 2024



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Well, it's the beginning of March, and we are well into our annual Lententide journeys. We have all begun afresh our annual, liturgical pilgrimage that shall conclude in our witnessing afresh the torment and betrayal of our Lord Jesus in a garden on the Mount of Olives on one night, followed by His torturous crucifixion, the very murder of God, upon a wooden cross on the skull-shaped hill, called *Golgatha*, the next day. It's all too easy to forget that Jesus' death on Good Friday is not the end of His story. But in order for us to get to Easter morning and relive the joy of our Lord Jesus walking freely and sovereignly out of His borrowed tomb, to leave it behind to remain empty forevermore, we must first journey with him through 40 days of sacrifice and temptation.

In my first call in the Church of Scotland Highland parish of Loch Broom and Ullapool, I had many parishioners who were hesitant to go through Lent's 40-day journey. For many, it was a practice they had never felt the need to observe. For some 'little old ladies', they wagged their fingers in my face and felt the need to tell me that I was trying to introduce alien practices that were "*Papist*", "*Roman*", and "*Episcopalian*." I remember one couple in particular who refused to attend Holy Week services because they wanted to go straight through from Palm Sunday to Easter. Yet, there were three little old ladies – Irene, Agnes, and Joan – who gave holy week a chance and attended "all the extra services". By Easter morning, these 3 came to me in floods of tears, saying that they never understood the connection from Palm Sunday to Easter morning, but because of Holy Week they now did, and they had an even deeper love for our Lord Jesus and His cross. Naturally, this warmed the cockles of my heart, yet also reminded me of the Apostle Paul's sentiment: *do all things decently and in good order* (1st Corinthians 14:40).

You see, brothers and sisters, the pilgrimage discipline of Lent is specifically designed to be one that spiritually transforms us into having a deeper appreciation for the Christian faith we'd rather forget. It's hard to get all the way through Lententide without feeling weary, emotionally drained, and running on empty. But we're not alone; our Lord Jesus knows all about being exhausted by the end of His 40-day journey through the wilderness. So, I guess this means that we're in good company, because our Lord Jesus understands our own weariness and He is able to help us during our time of temptation, exhaustion, and weariness. Perhaps, it's fitting that we take comfort from Scripture and remind ourselves that discipline at the time seems unpleasant, but later on it produces a harvest of righteousness (Hebrews 12:11). Have a blessed Lententide journey; may you finish strongly at the foot of the cross by keeping the home fires burning!
