CHAPEL OFFERING SERVICE PROJECT Our chapel offering for the 2nd Quarter (Oct. 10-Dec. 18)

is going to be collected for Trinity Lutheran Church and School of Mobile, Alabama. Recently Hurricane Sally devastated parts of the southern states. Seven of the Synod's historic black churches were among those in the path of the hurricane. All have buildings between 50 and 100 years old and significant history in the LCMS and the Southern District. The Rev. Dr. Roosevelt Gray, director of LCMS Black Ministry, said, "Those were seven of the 35 churches that Rosa Young started in the Southern District. ... All of those churches have a real history in the LCMS, as part of the largest collection of historic black congregations in the Synod. One of those churches will be celebrating its 100th anniversary this year. One [Trinity Lutheran Church and School in Mobile, Ala.] ... is the last congregation in the South where we have a Rosa Young school still in existence."

Johnson said that most of these seven congregations had sustained some kind of damage to their buildings or properties.

Gray said that damage to a church building is about more than just the costs and the difficulties of rebuilding.

"When people see those kinds of things happening to their church building, it creates a sense of depression, because that may be the place where they've spent all of their lives worshiping. That's where they have a history of weddings and funerals and choirs and events.

Trinity Lutheran School has an enrollment of 70 students in K-6, and 113 in Early Childhood.

Covid-19 has changed this school year and it has also affected how we will be doing our Children's Christmas Service at Bethlehem. This year ALL the students will be participating in a closed service that will be video taped during the school day on Wednesday, December 16th. This is to keep our attendance to a minimum and will provide families with a keepsake of this interesting year. More information will be sent home at a later date.
