The Significance and Joy of the Ascension

We confess in the Apostles' Creed "on the third day He (Jesus) rose from the dead, He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father almighty." We all know Easter is a big deal, and the Sunday of the Resurrection of our Lord is a big day, and thanks be to God for that. But there is more. Not only does the celebration of Easter continue for the 50 days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday, but in the midst of this, 40 days after Easter Sunday to be precise, the Church remembers and celebrates the Ascension of our Lord.

Though everyone knows the Church celebrates Easter, Ascension often gets overlooked. This ought not be. Our Lord's Ascension is of the greatest significance to His Church now as He ascends with the promise "I am with you always" (Matthew 28:20). He ascends in triumph not to be absent but ever present with His Church as He sends His Holy Spirit to call, gather, and enlighten by His Gospel. This is worth celebrating as we find our joy in Him who is our risen and ascended Lord.

Ascension always falls on a Thursday. This year it is May 18. We aren't used to church on a Thursday. Our lives are busy and some find it is hard enough to make the time on Sunday. I encourage you all to come and worship Christ the ascended king at our service here at Bethlehem, May 18 at 7:00pm. This is important as we find great joy in our Lord's Ascension.

The following is a brief meditation on our Lord's Ascension from Pastor Wilhelm Löhe. "It is written: 'God has gone up with a shout, the LORD with the sound of a trumpet!' He triumphs over all His enemies. He has imprisoned prison and released its dead. There is jubilation in heaven as thousands upon thousands of sinners repent; He who is the sacrifice for our sins is coming, bringing with Him His reward, His spoils. For the innumerable host of the redeemed righteous are remembered by God and His angels. How magnificent is the Lord's ascension!

"If there is joy over one sinner who repents, what joy there must have been in heaven among all the angels and the elect when the Savior, in whom alone all sinners can be saved, returned! Who can describe, imagine, or even conceive of the rejoicing and the singing and the hallelujah that our Lord Jesus Christ received? Not since the morning stars praised the Lord in His creation has there been a day like Ascension. It is the greatest feast; indeed, on that day in heaven a continuous feast began whose hymns of praise have not yet been stilled nor will they ever be. Yet these are things about which we can speak but little. When our time comes, however, we will partake in all of them, when in death our souls come to Zion and our bodies ascend to heaven on the last day to meet Christ in the air, as St. Paul writes."

Orphan Grain Train Hygiene Kits — Questions Answered Gifts from the Heart in Milwaukee

There have been some questions about the Orphan Grain Train (OGT) Hygiene Kits for Gifts from the Heart (GFTH) at the LWML Convention in Milwaukee and LWML Vice President of Gospel Outreach Karen Morrison responds below.

Can we deliver our Hygiene Kits to the OGT Warehouse near our district instead of hauling them to Milwaukee?

Response — Yes. If you have an OGT Warehouse in or near your district, you can deliver ingathering (GFTH) items there instead of bringing them to Milwaukee. We do ask that you keep an accurate count of the number of Hygiene Kits and quilts that you deliver. Bring that information with you to Milwaukee and deliver it to the GFTH collection room, so that your items will be included in the overall count.

What are the exact packing instructions for the OGT Hygiene Kits?

Response — Instructions for packing Hygiene Kits are included below. This information is from the OGT website. Due to customs regulations, it is important to follow these directions exactly.



HYGIENE KITS

CONTENTS ☐ 1 bath towel ☐ 1 sturdy comb ☐ 1 wash cloth ☐ 6 band-aids (1/2" OF 1/4") □ 1 bath-size bar of ☐ 1 small package soap facial tissues ☐ 1 plastic soap box ☐ 1 nail clipper holder □ 1 piece of strong ☐ 1 toothbrush ribbon or cord

ASSEMBLY

- 1. Lay out the towel on a flat surface.
- 2. Fold over about 5" on each long side.
- Place the rest of the items in the center under the folds.
- 4. Roll up the towel.
- Use ribbon or cord to tie the towel together in the middle.

PLEASE NOTE

- Dark colored linens are recommended.
- We recommend leaving contents in the original packaging, but it is not required.
- No additions, deletions, or substitutions.
- Do not add money, photos, or personal notes.
- Do not include items with religious, camouflage, patriotic or military symbols.
- Pack only new or gently used items.
- · Do not include plastic bags.
- It costs an average of \$11 to ship each box of kits. Please consider a donation to your local OGT branch to help with shipping.

Although well-meaning variations are tempting, please do not do this. It may result in heavy fines and/or the entire shipment being confiscated by customs officials.



Serving Those Who Serve

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod's (LCMS) Ministry to the Armed Forces (MAF) is authorized as the mission arm of the Synod to support and serve all military chaplains — active and reserve — their families and the veteran population. MAF recruits, interviews and endorses all military chaplains; sponsors annual training for all chaplains; and maintains close, pastoral relationships with chaplains after endorsement, offering counsel, training and advice throughout their entire careers.

n bunkers and fighter jets, on battleships and bases, in field hospitals and training camps, the men and women of the United States Armed Forces stand at the ready in service to our country.

With them are the 160 active and Reserve LCMS Armed Forces Chaplains stationed around the world. These pastors proclaim the Word of life, in environments often shrouded in death. Their flocks frequently come and go, providing scant opportunity for long-term ministry. Their work takes place in some of the most difficult situations any pastor could ever face, where lives can be unraveled in an instant.

Upholding these faithful servants is the Ministry to the Armed Forces (MAF), the LCMS effort to care for and support military chaplains and, through them, our LCMS members and their families in uniform.

The MAF exists to recruit, prepare, endorse and support LCMS chaplains in their service to God and country.

Authorized by the Synod and registered with the Department of

Defense. Chaplain Craig Muehler is the endorsing agent for LCMS military chaplains. There is a "lifelong marriage" between his office and the LCMS chaplains that includes ongoing contact and an annual visit with each chaplain. Through these visits and regular reports by phone and email, MAF helps the chaplains to stay connected with their church.

Each year, MAF gathers the chaplains at one of two training seminars, providing a rich opportunity for Lutheran worship, fellowship and study with LCMS seminary professors. Training and conversation is focused on the unique challenges of military chaplaincy.

Operation Barnabas, an extension of MAF, provides a network of care through trained congregations that want to reach out to members of the military, their families and the veterans in their congregations and communities.

Operation Barnabas has worked with dozens of congregations, but we realize hundreds more congregations also are caring for military families. We ask you to contact us, so we can recognize your work and encourage you as you serve military families.

OPERATION BARNABAS









The vision of Operation Barnabas is that every military-connected person lives in the hope and peace of God's love and mercy as revealed in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Our men and women in uniform have answered our nation's call to protect and defend us. In every time and place, they have stood the watch at home and abroad, often far from their families. Both active and reserve members of our military and their families continue to bear the burden of deployments to austere and dangerous locations. We invite you to help us to help them, and while doing so, share the love of Christ.

In 2007, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod's Ministry to the Armed Forces launched Operation Barnabas. Through this program — the only one of its kind in the U.S. — together with our congregations, we accomplish three key goals:

- Care for Reserve chaplains and their families and congregations.
- 2. Train and assist local congregations in their care and support of local military members and their families and veterans.
- 3. Serve as a resource to other organizations that provide care to military families and veterans.

- > We can forward information to you on a regular basis to better equip you to care for military families.

If you wish to be even more involved:

Become an Operation Barnabas Chapter. Operating in a manner similar to other chapters in your congregation — such as your Lutheran Women's Missionary League chapter — an Operations Barnabas Chapter meets monthly around a specific goal. In this case, the goal is to actively engage the military members in your community. Successful chapters depend on the volunteerism and leadership of a dedicated group of people in your congregation; this is not another task for pastor! This is a chance for your congregation to actively serve in your community and share the love of Christ with those who have borne the burden of defending our nation.



You have the opportunity to care for both those who are currently serving in the Armed Forces and those who have served in the past. Veterans and their families from every conflict are in need of your support.

If you served in uniform, thank you! Now you have the opportunity to serve again. You know the challenges, and you speak the same language as those in uniform.



In loving response to Christ, the Servant, the Orphan Grain Train movement encourages and enables God's people to share personal and material resources in bringing Christ's name and character to needy people both far and near. Sometimes that character expresses itself as a word well spoken,

sometimes as a bandage well applied, and sometimes as a child well fed.

What is Orphan Grain Train?

Orphan Grain Train is a 501c3 Nonprofit Christian volunteer network that shares personal and material resources with needy people in America and around the world. Grain Train volunteers gather donations of clothing, medical supplies, food, Christian literature, and other aid to meet real needs. The Orphan Grain Train movement is a loving response to Jesus Christ's example as a servant and His love for us.

Present Day

Since 1992, Orphan Grain Train's 27 regional locations have delivered more than 45 million fortified-rice meals and 4,230 shipments of humanitarian aid to needy people in several states and 69 countries on 5 continents. Orphan Grain Train built a mobile chapel with help from a grant funded by LCMS Disaster Relief division for St. John's Lutheran Church in Pilger, NE after their church was demolished by a F4 tornado. In October 2017 hurricane Michael ravaged the shoreline of Texas and a majority of Houston. Michael left behind homes and businesses in ruins and lives lost. Orphan Grain Train purchased and delivered 15 shipments of building construction materials and 5 semi-loads of groceries to help stock shelves in a food pantry feeding volunteers and those that have lost everything. In October 2018 OGT had 400 turkeys delivered for Thanksgiving meals to those still living in desperation a year later. The mission of Orphan Grain Train is uniquely dependent upon dedicated volunteers, many of whom have given numerous years of service for the sake of others. Since 1992, more than 4 million hours have been volunteered!




