You Must Be Born Again

¹Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. ²This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." ³Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." ⁴Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb

and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. ⁶That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' ⁸The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

⁹Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹⁰Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? ¹¹Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

¹⁶"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

P This is the Gospel of the Lord.



Athanasian Creed (spoken responsively)

¹Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.

²Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally.

³And the catholic faith is this, ⁴that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity,

neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.

⁵For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another.

⁶But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.

⁷Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit:

8the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;

9the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;

¹⁰the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.

¹¹And yet there are not three Eternals,

but one Eternal,

¹²just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites, but one Uncreated and one Infinite.

¹³In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;

¹⁴and yet there are not three Almighties, but one Almighty.

¹⁵So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;

¹⁶and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.

¹⁷So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord,

the Holy Spirit is Lord;

¹⁸and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.

¹⁹Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.

²⁰The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone.

²¹The Son is neither made nor created,

but begotten of the Father alone.

²²The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeding.

²³Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

²⁴And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another;

²⁵but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other and coequal, so that in all things, as has been stated above, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.

²⁶Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.

²⁷But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation

that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

²⁸Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man.

²⁹He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:

³⁰perfect God and perfect man,

composed of a rational soul and human flesh;

³¹equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity.

³²Although He is God and man,

He is not two, but one Christ:

³³one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh, but by the assumption of the humanity into God;

³⁴one altogether,

not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.

35For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ,

³⁶who suffered for our salvation,

descended into hell, rose again the third day from the dead,

³⁷ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

³⁸At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds.

³⁹And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire.

⁴⁰This is the catholic faith;

whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son

and to the Holy Spirit;

as it was in the beginning,

is now, and will be forever. Amen.


The Words of Our Lord
