The extra observances in the church such as midweek Advent services and special services around Christmas and New Years add to this increased devotion. In many ways Advent serves the Christian as a season of preparation. We are prepared to meet our coming Christ by hearing His Word and receiving His gifts to strengthen and keep us in the one true faith. In short, Advent is another occasion to order our days.

We have looked at ordering our days in the various orders of hearing God's Word and of prayer for throughout our day, now I wish to encourage you to fit such order into the season of Advent. You may already have specific devotions and long-standing family traditions - I encourage you to use them. But if you are looking for something else or something more to direct your hearts and minds this Advent and Christmas season, I direct you to a Daily Devotion book for Advent through Epiphany that Bethlehem has made available this year.







Tales for Tigers





Your school librarians would love to help you find a new family favorite in the school library!


