

AS WE GATHER

In today's Gospel from Mark, Jesus says, "Let us go on to the next towns, that I may preach there also, for that is why I came out." His ministry and mission for this world was one for all people. Even as Jesus early on in His earthly ministry heals people, including Simon's mother-in-law, so He comes to us still with healing through the forgiveness of sins. Blessed by Him and His unending grace, we can be rejuvenated and strengthened on "wings like eagles" and serve all in His name and "become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some . . . for the sake of the gospel."

REGARDING COMMUNION

Epiphany means "the manifesting" or "showing forth." Jesus was made known as God in flesh by the descent of the Holy Spirit and voice of the Father when baptized, as well as through the miracles of healing he did for the ill and suffering. We come to our Lord's Table as a people baptized into the name of the Holy Triune God ... as Christians who desire to continue in the faith and life of Jesus. Our Lord Jesus makes himself known to us still as we gather at the altar to receive his body and blood in the bread and wine for our forgiveness and healing and strength. Then we go forth to make him known to others in word and witness. Since Christian denominations have differing understandings of Holy Communion, if you are not a member of a Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod congregation and have not communed here before, we ask that you speak with the pastor or elder prior to communing with us the first time. Those not communing are invited to cross their arms over their chests and approach the pastor for a blessing during the distribution. Also, if certain factors prohibit you from partaking of regular wine, non-alcoholic wine is available in the center circle of the tray. If you would like to begin sharing this sacred meal with us on a regular basis, please ask the pastor for a time of faith instruction and formation.







That in my preaching I may present the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my right in the gospel.



But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.

Communion Distribution

Distribution of the Lord's gifts in Holy Communion is in standing format with Pastor and the Elder near the chancel steps. You will be released by the usher to head forward, maintaining physical distance between each person or family unit. Pastor will drop the wafer into your hands, so please cup them together and hold them chest-level. Individual plastic cups only are being used, so if you're not taking the non-alcoholic wine from the center, please make sure to take from the outer circle first until all of those are gone before reaching for the next level in. A basket to the left of the table is available for you to place your used cup inside.

Service Opportunities

Jeremiah 29:11 Warehouse Membership—Bethlehem has teamed up with three other congregations in town (Warrensburg Church of the Brethren, The Potter's House Evangelical Free Church, and Mt. Calvary Apostolic Church)—under the name Partners in Christ—to belong to this worthwhile community endeavor. Operating under the Manna Harvest umbrella, the warehouse enables local nonprofits to access product philanthropy (mostly from Amazon, Walmart, and CVS) for the meeting of their needs and those they serve. This is large-scale gleaning that prevents wastage and allows for the flourishing of wise stewardship. The annual membership cost for Partners in Christ is \$1,200, which is split equally by the four congregations, so that provides a total of \$12,000 in "purchasing power" at the warehouse throughout the year— \$3,000 for us and each partner. Darlene Laubenstein (Mission Board chair), Rebecca Stewart (Congregational Life Facilitator), and Pastor Joel are Bethlehem's three access people. Hygiene Product Collection—during the month of February, Mary-Martha Guild and the Mission Board will be collecting hygiene products for Nursing Homes and the Food Center. 


