

AS WE GATHER

There is nothing quite like being an eyewitness, giving a special perspective to share on the event. Peter writes about being on the Mount of Transfiguration as he, James, and John were privileged to have a special vision of the Lord Jesus Christ. He states: "We were eyewitnesses of His majesty. For when He received honor and glory from God the Father, and the voice was borne to Him by the Majestic Glory, 'This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased,' we ourselves heard this very voice borne from heaven, for we were with Him on the holy mountain" (2 Peter 1:16b–18). Today, through the words of Scripture, we, too, become eyewitnesses and are given a glimpse of glory in the vision of our transfigured Lord!

The pottery vessels on the altar remind us that although Holy Communion is not celebrated today, our Lord's sacred gifts are still central to our life of faith. Holy Communion is celebrated every 1st, 3rd, and 5th weekend (and major festivals).

Liturgical Color:


White is the color of purity and is associated with festivals of Christ and his Church.





Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, God shines forth.



Old Testament Reading..... Exodus 34:29-35

When Moses came down from Mount Sinai, with the two tablets of the testimony in his hand as he came down from the mountain, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. Aaron and all the people of Israel saw Moses, and behold, the skin of his face shone, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them, and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses talked with them. Afterward all the people of Israel came near, and he commanded them all that the Lord had spoken with him in Mount Sinai. And when Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil over his face.

Whenever Moses went in before the Lord to speak with him, he would remove the veil, until he came out. And when he came out and told the people of Israel what he was commanded, the people of Israel would see the face of Moses, that the skin of Moses' face was shining. And Moses would put the veil over his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

Epistle Reading2 Corinthians 3:12-18; 4:1-6

Since we have such a hope, we are very bold, not like Moses, who would put a veil over his face so that the Israelites might not gaze at the outcome of what

was being brought to an end. But their minds were hardened. For to this day, when they read the old covenant, that same veil remains unlifted, because only through Christ is it taken away. Yes, to this day whenever Moses is read a veil lies over their hearts. But when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit.

Therefore, having this ministry by the mercy of God, we do not lose heart. But we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled only to those who are perishing. In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

And as they were coming down the mountain, he charged them to tell no one what they had seen, until the Son of Man had risen from the dead.




Offering plates will not be passed during the service; worshipers may place their offerings into the plate located at the entrance.

Worship Services (Masks required at all services)

Sunday Services are at 10:30 a.m. You can also watch it live on Facebook or YouTube, or go to it directly from the webpage at blchurch.com.

Saturday Services are at 5:30 p.m. The order of worship is the shorter service of Early Evening Prayer. Holy Communion is observed on 1st, 3rd and 5th weekends of the month, as has been our regular practice.

An Ash Wednesday Communion Service will be held **this Wednesday the 17**th **at 7:00 p.m.** As we undertake the Lenten call of addressing our troubles, carrying our crosses in Christ, and emerging anew in Easter life, we'll focus on the root cause of disobedience we need to RELENT from—"Rebelliousness."

Retlent means "to give up or abandon—to become less severe, to soften" and is of central importance to the passage from Joel that sets the tone for Lent: "Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the Lord your God?" (2:13b-14). Re- is a prefix meaning "to go back or retrace to the original—to do again." In the season of Lent (which has its origin in the root of the word "length"), we head through lengthening daylight toward Easter/spring and find that as we face what darkens our lives. Join us for the following Wednesday Services as we discover anew the blessing of loss and gain through the cross and resurrection of Jesus. February 24-Excuses, March 3-Lambasting, March 10-Excess, March 17-Negativity, & March 24-Trashing.

Service Opportunities

Jeremiah 29:11 Warehouse Membership—Bethlehem has teamed up with three other congregations in town (Warrensburg Church of the Brethren, The Potter's House Evangelical Free Church, and Mt. Calvary Apostolic Church)—under the name Partners in Christ—to belong to this worthwhile community endeavor. Operating under the Manna Harvest umbrella, the warehouse enables local nonprofits to access product philanthropy (mostly from Amazon, Walmart, and CVS) for the meeting of their needs and those they serve. This is large-scale gleaning that prevents wastage and allows for the flourishing of wise stewardship. The annual membership cost for Partners in Christ is \$1,200, which is split equally by the four

congregations, so that provides a total of \$12,000 in "purchasing power" at the warehouse throughout the year—\$3,000 for us and each partner. Darlene Laubenstein (Mission Board chair), Rebecca Stewart (Congregational Life Facilitator), and Pastor Joel are Bethlehem's three access people. Hygiene Product Collection—during the month of February, Mary-Martha Guild and the Mission Board will be collecting hygiene products for Nursing Homes and the Food Center. 


