White is the color of purity and is associated with festivals of Christ and his Church



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
Epistle Reading Philippians 4:4-13

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


Offering


Offering plates are not being passed during the service; worshipers may place their offerings into the plate located at the west entrance.

Sending Hymn...... "We Are but Pilgrims Here"

(Tune: "Heaven is my Home")

We are but pilgrims here, / Earth is our home. Not always seen so clear, / Earth is our home. No matter where we stand, / Round us on ev'ry hand; Earth is our motherland, / Earth is our home.

Made by the Lord Divine, / Earth is our home; Who made the water wine, / Earth is our home. Pledge of the wedding feast, / For greatest and the least, May we all live in peace, / Earth is our home.

When on that coming day, / Heaven and Earth; Made new, so boldly say, / "Christ is our worth!" Tears He will wipe away, / And with His creatures stay, For the eternal day –**of**—Heaven and Earth.

I wrote this hymn text in 2014 as a corollary to Thomas R. Taylor's well-known "I'm But a Stranger Here," which taken on its own can seem a total disparagement of the Lord's good but suffering Creation. Many have found comfort in that hymn's longing for heaven during times of hardship and loss, so I didn't want to discredit the validity of that but did want to direct attention to the biblical truths that the Lord made the earthly realm "very good" (Gen. 1:31), that the Son of God entered it fully in order to redeem and restore it (John 1:14), and that we long for the day when the "holy city" comes down from heaven to earth and God dwells with people once again in a new and fulfilled way (Rev. 21:1-4).

Thomas Taylor (1807-1835) lived a short life, as you can see, plagued by ill health and the bleak hope of recovery—which comes through his "I'm But a Stranger Here" hymn (which has appeared in 601 hymnals). His much lesser known hymn "Earth, with Her Ten Thousand Flowers" (in only 64 hymnals, with the refrain: "God is love") shows that earthly life was not all "desert drear" to him and that he also saw the abundant goodness of the Lord's Creation too. My text is in that vein, linking up with the realization of Psalm 84:4: "Blessed are those whose strength is in you, O Lord, whose hearts are set on the pilgrim's way!" and the conviction we state in the Nicene Creed: "I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." This year has given plenty of occasions for being reminded of that! (JRK)
