



AS WE GATHER

The First Sunday in Lent begins with the temptation of Jesus. Alone in the wilderness, Jesus faces the temptations of the devil, who tries to use God's own Word to entrap Jesus. The collect reminds us that we are also walking through the wilderness of this world, taunted and tempted by the devil, who still uses God's Word to entrap us. Jesus does not simply show us how to resist but reveals that our strength lies in the same Word of God. In Christ, we stand strong against the wiles of the devil and, when and if we fall, we find refuge in Christ to be forgiven and restored.

REGARDING COMMUNION

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, the forty days of Lent mark off our journey to Easter. When we were baptized into the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, the sign of the cross was made upon our foreheads and hearts to mark us as people redeemed by the cross of the Christ. We rose to newness of life through the resurrection of Jesus and began a life of pilgrimage in faith. The cross of ash made on our foreheads at the beginning of Lent reminds us that the Christian life is one of repentance (or change from wrongs done) ... a life of constant returning to our Lord's Table to be forgiven and renewed, for here we have the bread of Christ's Body and the wine of his Blood as strength for the journey. Since Christian denominations have differing understandings of Holy Communion, if you are not a member of a Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod congregation and have not communed here before, we ask that you speak with the pastor or elder prior to communing with us the first time. Those not communing are invited to cross their arms over their chests and approach the pastor for a blessing during the distribution. Also, if certain factors prohibit you from partaking of regular wine, non-alcoholic wine is available in the center circle of the tray. If you would like to begin sharing this sacred meal with us on a regular basis, please ask the pastor for a time of faith instruction and formation.

Liturgical Color:

Purple is the color of humility and repentance.


Near the large cross by the pulpit is a basket with slips of paper, pencils, and tacks. Feel free to write down any of your burdens, worries, wrongs, and sins and tack them to the cross at any time during this season of Lent. They will not be read but removed on Good Friday and burned in the Easter Vigil fire on Holy Saturday. Our Lord takes our darkness and replaces it with his light!



Take a Lenten Journey with Joseph—The last thirteen of Genesis's fifty chapters deal exclusively with the epic saga of Joseph. While his name means "he adds/increases," for a long stretch it seemed nothing but unlucky—subtraction and decreasing to say the least! Nevertheless, Joseph's life of being sinned against by others became a powerful demonstration of the Lord's faithful mercy and freeing forgiveness. It's really no surprise that surveying the pivotal events of his life helps us grasp more insightfully the suffering and saving life-work of Jesus. Join us for Wednesdays in Lent as we undertake A Lenten Journey with Joseph and see how it all relates to the intersection of our lives with Joseph's—and more, with the cross of Jesus. The weekly themes we'll be exploring are: 1) The Genesis of Joseph & Our Return, 2) A Wondrous Silence, 3) A Miracle of Miracles, 4) Wait for the Lord, 5) Chased by a Dirty Conscience, 6) God Does Have a Plan, 7) Forgiveness Finished (Good Friday). All services will be at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary, with Holden Evening Prayer—except for Good Friday.

Spring Mission Festival—The weekend services on **March 26 & 27** will call attention to the ongoing work of Food For The Poor—an ecumenical Christian agency (based in Florida) which provides life's basic necessities to the impoverished in Latin America and the Caribbean. Sunday School and Christian Education

Lenten Home Devotions

Reflecting on Jesus' Cross (and Ours) this Lent—A wooden cross and devotional card was handed out Ash Wednesday. Each Wednesday service an accompanying item will be given as well. Set the cross in a prominent place within your home and reflect on the connected passages from Scripture (and each new item) throughout each week, then incorporate what you glean from that in your prayers and actions and share that with someone else who might need to hear that.

Faith Discussion and Bible Study

Sunday Bible Study is working through the book *Death, Heaven, Resurrection, and the New Creation* (by Concordia Seminary faculty) and discussing our way through Scripture and personal experiences so that we can all be strengthened in believing and living through Christ's own life, death, and resurrection. Wednesday Bible Study is currently exploring the short book of Jonah. Join us in the conference room from 10:30 to noon as we see what Jonah has to do with us.
