

# October 29-30, 2021 Reformation Weekend

#### **AS WE GATHER**

When Jesus walks through the door, things change. Hardened hearts start to soften. Those who have tried to remove God from their daily lives now find themselves feasting with Him. Even as the religious elite grumble about what is happening, things are changing for the souls of those who are lost in sin. And all this change is taking place simply because Jesus walked through the door—into Zacchaeus's house and into his heart—salvation has come! The same Lord who condemns and punishes sin now brings restoration to the repentant sinner. Lost souls take steps toward home. Severed relationships begin to mend. Broken lives find healing and renewal. "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10). These same realities from the house of Zacchaeus are true for us today. Jesus has come into this holy house and, for all who offer here their worship and praise, He brings the blessing of His salvation!

REGARDING COMMUNION When we gather at the Lord's Table, the cup of blessing we receive is a sharing in the blood of Christ; the bread we break is a sharing in the body of Christ. We who are many are one bread and body in Christ (I Cor. 10:16-17). As a people baptized into the life of God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Jesus comes to us in this holy meal to renew us individually and together in our life of faith and following him. Since Christian denominations have differing understandings of Holy Communion, if you are not a member of a Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod congregation and have not communed here before, we ask that you speak with the pastor or elder prior to communing with us the first time. Those not communing are invited to cross their arms over their chests and approach the pastor for a blessing during the distribution. Also, if certain factors prohibit you from partaking of regular wine, non-alcoholic wine is available in the center circle of the tray. If you would like to begin sharing this sacred meal with us on a regular basis, please ask the pastor for a time of faith instruction and formation.

**Liturgical Color:** 

Red is the color of lifeblood and is associated with the Holy Spirit.



"Singing with Luther". As Lutherans across the globe commemorate the Reformation this weekend, the strains of *A Mighty Fortress* will fill churches and the worshippers will sing Lutheran doctrine. Next year will mark the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Martin Luther's first hymn, written in German. While this idea does not seem so revolutionary, it certainly was in 1523. Singing in the church was done by a choir and was not done in the vernacular. The fact that Dr. Luther and other early supporters of the Reformation began to set Lutheran doctrine to song in the language of the people became extremely influential. (President Hagen).
