Solomon began his book of Proverbs with this intention: "To know wisdom and instruction, to understand words of insight, to receive instruction in wise dealing, in righteousness, justice, and equity..." (1:2-3). In the same vein of striving for wisdom in the unfolding experiences of life, the psalmist prayed this distilled plea: "So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom" (90:12). We know that this new year has 12 months and 365 days (but remember, this is a leap year!) like all the ones that preceded it, but "numbering" our days means knowing that not all of us are promised the full amount ... while also valuing each day by spending it toward the highest and fullest purpose.

All of which got me thinking of a little book from 28 years ago to which I refer from time to time—Kent Nerburn's *Simple Truths: Clear & Gentle Guidance on the Big Issues of Life.* Nerburn, who holds a Ph.D. in Religion and Art, spent several years helping collect the memories of Ojibwe tribal elders—an exercise in distilled wisdom, to say the least! Below are twelve gems for you to consider—one a month—and I'll let you choose which one goes with which.

- 1) We should remember the caution of the Chinese sage, Confucius, who told his followers, "Study without thinking and you are blind; think without studying and you are in danger."
- 2) You should think of work as **vocation** ... which comes from the word for **voice**.... It touches on what work really should be—something that calls to you, that gives voice to who you are.

- 3) Money can tyrannize the wealthy as easily as the poor.... It is as important to know how to be poor as it is to know how to be rich.
- 4) We must remember that most possessions are really butterflies that turn into cate pillars.
- 5) Giving is a miracle that can transform the heaviest of hearts.... You will start to feel what is common among us, not what separates and differentiates us.
- 6) Time spent alone returns to you a hundredfold, because it is the proving ground of the spirit. You quickly find out if you are at peace with yourself, or if the meaning of your life is found only in the superficial affairs of the day.
- 7) True strength is not about force, but about conviction. It lives at the center of belief where fear and uncertainty cannot gain a foothold.... True strength does not magnify others' weaknesses. It makes others stronger.
- 8) Tragedy and suffering will come to you. You cannot insulate yourself from them.... Like love, they make you more a part of the human family.... They are the fire that burns you pure.
- 9) Spiritual understanding never becomes deep unless you subject yourself to the spiritual discipline of practicing your belief.
- 10) Love the elders. Honor them. Go to them with a pure heart, unblinded by notions of false reverence or obligation.... Listen to them. Observe them like a far-off country t that you will someday visit, and learn the lessons that they have to teach.
- 11) Along with the gift of purity of heart, a child gives you the gift of understanding.... A child, whether of your own blood or someone else's, whether healthy or ill, whether beautiful of misshapen, is one of life's greatest miracles.
- 12) Travel, no matter how humble, will etch new elements in your character. You will know the cutting moments of life where fear meets adventure and loneliness meets exhilaration. You will know what it means to push forward when you want to turn back.

"Christ Jesus, who became to us **wisdom** from God" (I Corinthians 1:30) taught his disciples long ago to combat their anxiety by learning from the birds of the air and the lilies of the field ... by seeing the abundance of troubles for each day, but more, by seeing the necessity of seeking God's kingdom first and trusting all needs to be met (see Matthew 6:25-34). So may it be for us—every day we live—by grace!

American Heritage Girls and Trail Life USA Are Coming to Warrensburg!

Many of you know that Jeremy and the kids and I are involved in American Heritage Girls and Trail Life USA. The Pederson and Murrell families are too! American Heritage Girls is a Christ-centered character development program for girls ages 5-18 whose mission is to build women of integrity through badge programs, service, leadership, and outdoor experiences. Trail Life USA is a similarly Christ-centered mentoring and discipleship program for boys ages 5-18 that focuses on character development, service, and leadership though outdoor adventure. Yes, these programs are similar to Girl Scouts and Scouts. The key difference is that they are always chartered by Christian churches, and they are Biblically based. Girls and boys learn about the Bible and how to apply its teaching in their lives in every aspect of their involvement in each program.

We have been involved as leaders in the troops chartered at Faith Lutheran Church in Knob Noster. The Trail Life USA troop has been there since 2019 and I helped to start the American Heritage Girls troop there in 2022. I am thrilled to tell you that in the short time of our involvement, both troops have TRIPLED in size! We have outgrown the church! Our community is so hungry for these programs that Jeremy and I, along with our friends the Becraft family, felt called to start a troop here in Warrensburg to accommodate continued growth. So that's what we're doing! Starting in January, AHG and TLUSA troops MO0226 will be launching at Northside Christian Church. There were some men at Northside with a Scouting history who have been eager to welcome Trail Life to the church for some time, so we capitalized on that interest and Northside's expansive space, including numerous classrooms, to ensure the room for the growth that we know will happen.


