Continue to lean into who you are and how you live that out, continue to lean into the God who sustains both, and I know you will continue to weather the storms and the feasts still before. I'm sad to leave, but I can't wait to come back and see what you've done while I've been starting my next path!

COUNCIL UPDATE



With joy and thanksgiving, Congregation Council is pleased to provide this update!

We continue striving to enhance the audiovisual aspects of in-person and online worship. Members who primarily worship online continue expressing gratitude for the ability to be with us every Sunday. We recently added an online worship registration form and online worship feedback form, the purpose of which is to learn and grow from our online worshippers' feedback. We encourage online worshippers to let us know you're here and to provide feedback each week about your experience.

Audit Committee members Brent Anderson, Tammy Nadaskay and Ellen Slezak, along with Mary Keller who is serving as subject matter expert, conducted their kickoff meeting where they discussed approach and objectives for the audit. Mary shared the ELCA congregational audit guide and other helpful resources, which the committee now is using to establish an outline and timeline for the 2024 audit.

As a congregation we are committed to retiring the debt as quickly as possible. Thank you again, Calvary for your bold and faithful financial gifts, which realized our 2024 stretch goal of reducing mortgage principal to half the original principal amount!! As of May 31st, our mortgage balance is \$919,547. Through May, offerings are approximately \$23k or 6.5% lower than budget. This time last year, we were behind budget on offerings but to a lesser degree (\$16k or 4.7%). Expenses are approximately \$10k under budget, resulting in a year-to-date deficit of approximately \$13k. Thank you for your continued financial support of Calvary's ministries.

In the annual meeting, the congregation approved distributing half of the 2024 surplus to our Future Bus Replacement Fund. This fund was established with the intent of saving early for the next bus replacement, which is now time to consider in earnest. The current balance is ~\$46k or about one-third of the estimated cost of a new bus. In the coming months we will develop and share details of a plan for Calvary's next bus purchase.

We continue to pray for Intern Rebecca's first call process, with gratitude for joining in this journey with her, and look forward to celebrating her internship on July 27th! Our next internship will look different because of this year's low availability of interns. We remain active in the ELCA intern program and will continue working with the seminaries for a traditional internship for 2026-2027. Specifics of our 2025-2026 internship will be communicated as they develop.

A special thank you to the Calvary Café crew and patrons, whose management and support of the café allowed Calvary to purchase a new commercial freezer for NEED West as a replacement for the one that failed. Thank you, Calvary Café!




