There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, <sup>5</sup> one Lord, one faith, one baptism, <sup>6</sup> one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. Ephesians 4:4-6

Calvary Lutheran Church elected its Call Committee this past Sunday in a Special Congregational Meeting. I took the opportunity to address the assembly and shared with members some of what I have learned about the call process through my own experience as a pastor and later as bishop overseeing many call processes in the Church. In my comments I emphasized the importance of prayer and discernment on the part of the whole congregation as well as the individual members of the call committee in their work. Also important is the ongoing prayer and discernment among pastors and deacons who are contemplating a change in their own call to ministry, some of whom might have the gifts needed and openness to serve as Lead Pastor at Calvary. In the call process God opens up possibilities through the life of the Spirit and invites the Church into a time of prayer and discernment.

I recalled a story from my time as bishop while serving in the Central States Synod (Missouri and Kansas). A lay person in one of our congregations had been chosen to serve on the call committee at his congregation. He worked in the business world, an executive responsible for a large division of a major corporation. He was eager to find a new pastor for the congregation, dutifully agreed to serve on the Call Committee and was subsequently elected the chair. The process took several months, but finally a pastor was called.

When I came to install the pastor on a Sunday morning, this lay person pulled me aside and shared with me what he had learned from the experience. He said he had initially approached the call process the way he would have hired someone in the company where he worked. He would have simply screened the applicants, interviewed the candidates, selected the best and made an offer. But after having worked through the processes of the church he said to me, "I now realize how much the calling of a pastor is a spiritual endeavor and how important prayer is to discerning where and how God may be leading. I learned to be open to God's surprises."

There are certainly the nuts and bolts that are an important part of a call process, elements which are very similar to a hiring process in the world of business, government or higher education. There is paper-work to be filled out, references to be checked, interviews and conversations to be scheduled.

But if we believe and trust that Jesus is Lord of the Church and the congregation is bound together in the life of the Spirit, then the calling of a pastor is a deeply spiritual process. And a Spirit-led call process in the calling of a pastor will be one that is enveloped in prayer. By that I mean the whole Church will be engaged in prayer.

The call committee will be praying for the Spirit's guidance and wisdom as members seek to discern where God might be leading and what gifts might be present and needed at this time in the life of the congregation. At the same time members of the congregation lift up the call committee in prayer, seeking the Spirit's blessing upon the committee in their work and upon the pastors who are open to receiving a call and serving in a new place and context. And during this whole process pastors in places near and far who are open to a change of call are engaged in prayer and discerning the movement of the Spirit. They are wondering where God might be at work in calling forth their gifts for service in Christ's Church.

You will notice the whole Church is engaged in prayer, operating not out of self-interest or feelings of scarcity, but in anticipation of what God may be doing and how God will be providing for the building up of Christ's Church.

Thus I offer this prayer: Gracious God, you have called this congregation into being through the Good News of Jesus Christ and given Calvary gifts for your mission in the world. Accompany us now in the calling of a new Lead Pastor and give strength, courage and wisdom to those serving on the Call Committee. Help us all to lean on you for guidance and to trust your Spirit. Keep us open to the possibilities you create. Move us to discern the gifts Calvary needs and to see those gifts in those you send. Give us vision for this time in Calvary's life and cause us to remember you are the One who called us into being and given us life. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

#### An update from Andy Bake, Council President:

Thank you to all of our members who were able to attend our congregational meeting on Sunday, April 23. At this meeting, we selected a call committee, who will be tasked with interviewing prospective pastor candidates and making a recommendation to call a new pastor for Calvary to the church council and congregation.

While this is a time of uncertainty for Calvary as we await the call of our next pastor, it is also a time of excited anticipation as we prepare for the opportunity to continue to strengthen our mission to serve God and one another.

As we begin this call process, the council and I share a desire to call a permanent pastor as soon as we are able. However, we also strongly believe it is more important to ensure we select the right pastor for our congregation than it is to select a pastor quickly. As a result, we intend to engage in a deliberate process that may take a little longer than some would like. This is not because we are dragging our feet or because we don't have an urgency to move forward. It is because this is an important decision for our congregation at a critical time. As we all know, COVID and some instability within the congregation over the last few years has resulted in challenges, including a loss of members and reduced attendance. Selecting the right pastor is vitally important- far too important to rush. We also want to work closely with the Synod to use their recommended process.

As the call committee works, our council and some additional members of the congregation will be working at the same time to prepare for a new pastor and to strengthen our position to remain a strong and vibrant congregation far into the future. The work of these committees is outlined below.

Ministry Site Profile Committee: This committee is working to develop the ministry site profile to be submitted to the Synod. The ministry site profile is a document that is shared with pastors who have expressed an interest in a call to Calvary. The information we provide assists these candidates in developing an understanding of our congregation, or ministry, and our community. This is important work which really sets the stage for ensuring the call committee is interviewing candidates who would likely be a good fit for our congregation. It is also important in that we want to make sure we are providing prospective candidates an honest and accurate representation of who Calvary is as a congregation, who we hope to be in the future, and what kind of leader we believe is necessary to help us get there.

Constitution Committee: Our congregational constitution has not been updated in many years and is based on a model that existed before the formation of the ELCA. The council would like to review our constitution and ensure our guiding documents more closely align with the model ELCA constitution. This will be a slower, deliberate process- both to ensure we do things correctly and to ensure we are in compliance with our current constitution- which requires that any constitutional changes be ratified at two consecutive annual meetings. Over the upcoming months, a committee will review our constitution, develop recommended changes, and will hold meetings with the congregation to explain the rationale behind recommended changes. We will clearly articulate the differences between our current constitution and recommended changes. We also hope to include information in The Visitor to reach members who aren't able to attend scheduled meetings. The goal is that our congregational members understand any recommended changes prior to January so that we can make an informed decision about adopting an updated constitution. Many ELCA congregations have adopted the model ELCA constitution as recommended. Our intention is that if ratified by the congregation, our constitution would more closely resemble the model ELCA constitution.

Church Structures Committee: The third committee will work with consultant Cathy Cowling to review our church structures, including staff roles, the way our council functions, the way our committees function, and how decisions are made in our congregation. Cathy has worked with many congregations of all denominations to help assess the life and ministry of the church and help the congregation move forward in a positive Spirit-led manner. Some of you may remember Cathy from the Looking Back, Looking Forward event a few months ago.

Obviously, the work of these committees cannot and should not happen without honoring our past as a strong and vibrant congregation. We don't want to set aside our history and all of the wonderful things happening at Calvary. Many talented and dedicated people have made Calvary who we are today. We want to set a course for the future that builds on all the ways we serve God, our community, and one another. Calvary has remained a strong and faithful community for over 70 years due to the commitment of our congregation. I am confident that we will continue to be just as strong into the future with your continued prayers and support.


