

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age. (Matthew 28:19-20)

We are at that time of year when a new school year is beginning. Young adults are off to college, children are excited about entering a new grade level, teachers are preparing their classrooms and administrators are making sure all systems are ready for a good school year. I give thanks this time of year for educators in both public and private institutions who devote their lives for the care and nurture of precious children, youth and young adults.

Lutherans have placed a high value on education since the earliest days of the Reformation. Martin Luther gave thanks for the gift of reason and encouraged the establishment of schools for all children. I appreciate a prayer in **Evangelical Lutheran Worship** in which we ask God "...to bless schools, colleges and universities that they may be *lively places* for *sound learning*, *new discovery*, and the *pursuit of wisdom*." I have italicized words which I think are important values for we who find the source of all truth to be found in God whom we know most clearly in Jesus Christ.

The Evangelist Matthew tells us "...Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people (4:23)." As Jesus ushered in the reign of God he was teaching the disciples about the faithfulness of God, the way of love and service, and what it would mean to place one's trust in God above everything else. From the earliest days of his ministry Jesus was focused on the formation of a community of faith and love that witnessed in word and deed to the reign of God breaking into the world.

Healthy Christian congregations are committed to Christian education among people of all ages, from the youngest of children to the oldest of adults. Sometimes when we hear the word "education" we think only of the imparting of knowledge. That is certainly a core element but Christian education is more than just learning the teachings of the faith. Christian education is helping people to embrace the teachings, to grow and be formed with faith and love in Christ. Hence I prefer to speak about Christian formation instead of Christian education because the goal is for the life of Christ to be formed in and among every believer in the community of faith.

In his letter to the Romans the Apostle Paul says, "...Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect (12:2). Paul described the transformation in his own life in this way: "...I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live but Christ who lives in me (Galatians 2:20). Paul knew it was a daily struggle to put away the old and let the new life of Christ shine. Thus Christian education or formation needs to be part of our lives until we breath our last.

At Calvary our Sunday School programs and confirmation classes will begin in September. I will initially be offering an Adult Forum with various speakers focusing on the outreach ministry of the congregation. I know there are some Bible studies that lay members lead and many participate in. I give thanks for the people who faithfully volunteer to teach these classes and for parents who bring their children to learn and grow in the faith. But I also wonder what other possibilities for education are yet to be imagined that would grab the hearts of people, feed our minds with knowledge and help Calvary to grow in deeper faith and love.

Healthy, vibrant, and numerically growing Christian congregations are committed to Christian education, that is the ongoing formation of Christian faith in the lives of people. One cannot grow a congregation without feeding and nurturing the faith and life of the people. As he ascended into heaven Jesus gave the disciples some marching orders that included baptizing those new to the faith and teaching them what it means to walk as servants of God. Learning is a lifelong process for the children of God. Lest we feel daunted by the challenge, the Risen Christ has promised to be with us to the end of time.




