

For freedom Christ has set us free (Galatians 5:1).

In his letter to the congregation in Galatia, the Apostle Paul stressed the freedom of the Gospel, specifically that Christians are freed from the law of Moses. Some in Galatia seem to have thought the message of Jesus Christ was good news but the law still needed to be followed. They thought Gentile followers of Jesus were expected to take on the heritage of Israel and keep these laws. Thus male Gentile believers needed to be circumcised as Jewish men had. Believing Gentile families were to keep a kosher table in their meals at home and observe the dietary laws in the congregational meals as did Jewish followers. Paul argued Christ has set us free from the law as well as from the power of sin and death.

We rejoice in freedom. Especially in this country we celebrate freedom. Let freedom ring we cry out, remembering those who have given their lives in wars from revolutionary days to the present. But Paul is quick to point out to the Galatians, and to us, that freedom does not absolve us of responsibilities. Paul says,

For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Galatians 5:13-14)

We are in the midst of a stewardship campaign themed, "Freed to Serve". For a number of Sundays representatives from ministries supported by Calvary are telling the story about the impact of Calvary's outreach upon the lives of people. The ministries highlighted include:

St. John's Ministries
New Community Shelter
Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan
Crossways Camping Ministry
Sleep in Heavenly Peace
ELCA World Hunger

I know that Rev Dan Rift, the Director of ELCA World Hunger and Disaster Response, will remind us God's mission is global as well as local and that financial support of synod and churchwide ministries brings hope and healing to the lives of people whose names we will never know and whose faces we may never see. Calvary has been generous with mission support throughout its history. Calvary's mission support, along with that of the 9,000 ELCA congregations throughout the United States and the Caribbean, means the broader Church is doing work in places where we cannot physically be present ourselves.

Bishop Anne Edison-Albright will be at Calvary on Sunday, November 5, preaching in both services. She will also meet with the congregation between services and talk about some of the exciting things happening in the East Central Synod of Wisconsin as well as in other places in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The bishop will share stories of how Calvary is participating in God's mission because of your generous mission support.

October 22 is Celebration/Consecration Sunday when members of the congregation will be invited to present their Statements of Intent for the coming year. I hope you will make an extra effort to be present that day. I hope also you will give prayerful thought and consideration to how you can support Calvary's participation in God's mission in the world.

We Christians do not "lay down the law" and say this is what every member must do to be in good standing. We take seriously the Good News of Jesus Christ, that we are freed from the demands of the law. We are freed also from the power of sin that makes us curve inward and think only of ourselves. But we do exhort one another to not grow weary in doing what is right (Galatians 6:9). There is much in the Church, here at Calvary and in the larger Church, that is worthy of our financial support. Good things are happening within the life of Calvary, including the calling of a new pastor. Lives are touched as faith is formed and love and service is encouraged among us. Generous financial support will help insure that good work continues to happen within the congregation and in the mission of the larger Church.

There are many organizations that ask for our financial support. There are many ways you and I can spend the money that has been entrusted to us. The financial appeal is different among Christians; this appeal grows out of God's love and mercy in Jesus Christ. The Spirit of the Risen Christ moves among us and blesses us with what Paul calls "the fruit of the Spirit": love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23). Notice that word "generosity" among those gifts. I pray Calvary, caught up in the life of the Spirit, would be known for extravagant generosity. Generous in love, generous in kindness, generous in speaking of one another, and, yes, generous in financial support of the Church. We have been "Set Free to Serve."

### Ingredients

- 2 lbs ground beef
- 2 cans cream of mushroom soup
- 1- 32oz package of tater tots
- 2 medium onions
- 1 lb frozen mixed vegetables OR 2 cans of green beans

Brown the ground beef and diced onions. Drain. Combine the meat mixture, soup, and vegetables. Mix thoroughly and pour into a 9 x 13 disposable aluminum pan (from Calvary). Top with tater tots. Cover with foil.


### Youth Gathering Fundraising
