

### **Forming Community**

For where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am among them. (Matthew 18:20)

Gathering in community, particularly Christian community, is a gift. Dietrich Bonhoeffer in *Life Together* writes, "It is by God's grace that a congregation is permitted to gather visibly around God's word and sacrament in this world. Not all Christians partake of this grace... They know that visible community is grace." And the grace of our visible life together has been easily taken for granted in a bygone era; when participation in congregational life was assumed and church attendance was seen as a duty.

Today, the world has changed. Congregational life cannot be assumed. And church attendance is approached like an a la carte menu of choices and options. Communities have become divided in how to respond to the changing reality around them. Some argue for a return to practices that worked in the days of full sanctuaries and building expansions. Others argue to embrace new and contemporary practices to attract new folks. This leaves communities fragmented and at odds with one another while people are experiencing severe loneliness and isolation. There is a keen hunger for connection and belong. And yet, it has been difficult for faith communities to faithfully engage with those who desperately need a community.

This Lent, we are exploring Deitrich Bonhoeffer's *Life Together* to examine our own life together. The central claim in Bonhoeffer's book is simple, yet the implications are profound: "We belong to one another on through and in Jesus Christ." Deitrich Bonhoeffer found himself in Germany in the mid-1930s. He directed an underground seminary at Zingst and Finkenwalde from 1935-1937, before there was yet a loyalty oath to the Führer or extreme public violence against the Jewish minority. "There were, however, already many other ominous signs of the times..." (Rev. Dr. Craig L. Nessan, Wartburg Seminary). Bonhoeffer sought to imagine a Christian community that would form people to be *intentionally Christian* in a time and place that had mostly forgotten what that means. Our challenge, today as in Bonhoeffer's time, is to imagine how an intentionally Christian community emerges from fragmentation.

Bonhoeffer's simple, yet profound, solution is to place Christ at the very heart of the community. "It means, *first*, that a Christian needs others for the sake of Jesus Christ. It means, *second*, that a Christian comes to others only through Jesus Christ. It means, *third*, that from eternity we have been chosen in Jesus Christ, accepted in time, and united for eternity." (Bonhoeffer, *Life Together*, 5). In other words, when Christ is at the heart of community, it allows that community to be messy, complicated, imperfect, and still together. As Christ's church, we are called to be different together. This is how God has always intended the church to be.

Consider the disciples Jesus gathers: one a betrayer, one a doubter, one a denier. At the end of Christ's ministry here on earth, the disciples all abandoned Jesus. The community that Jesus gathered and cultivated was nothing but messy, complicated, and imperfect. And still, because Jesus was at the heart of their gathering, they were still gathered in that upper room waiting for some good news on easter morning. They continued in ministry to change the entire world for centuries after they were finished here on earth. Because they were bound to one another in and through Christ, they were "accepted in time, and united in eternity." Their legacy we carry on today. It certainly looks different. It may even sound different. And still, the heart of our gatherings is the same: Jesus Christ.

As we journey through the remaining days of Lent, I invited you to reflect on why it is you gather in Christian community. Why is it important to you? What are the things that weaken it? What are the things that strengthen it? And, ultimately, how are you called to cultivate that community that Christ is gathering?

Our answers may be different. Our callings are most certainly different. And, when we insist on letting Christ be the heart and center of our community, we will find that there is more than enough room for all of us in this life together.

### **Community Impact**

Thank you for your continued partnership with EPH! With your support, EPH provided housing and case management for 60 families – including 162 children – last year. An additional 36 families – including 83 children – were served through our prevention program to help them avoid experiencing homelessness in 2023. We are currently housing **33** families, including **92** children.

Your prayers, volunteer hours, and financial contributions are truly making a difference for many families in our community. Thank you for helping carry out our mission of providing safety, stability, and solutions leading to self-sufficiency for families facing homelessness.

The request came in a few days before and when I talked to the Mom about the need for a bed she shared her story about how her life had changed two years ago. You see she and her future husband were in a tragic auto accident and unfortunately he didn't survive. She was left to raise their two year old son alone and the medical bills forced them into homelessness. After two long years she was finally able to get an apartment for the two of them but didn't have the funds to buy a bed for her now four year old son.

On the delivery day our team assembled the single bed in the completely empty room with the usual care. I snapped my photo of the dinosaur blanket on the bed that was just donated two days before by kids from a local grade school. As we were heading out the door I let Mom know that we were finished. She came in and called out to her son to come and check out his bed. I was expecting the typical excitement we normally get when kids see their own bed. But not today! Oh no, he stood next to it and was as brutally honest as a child and said "I don't like it!" My heart dropped! What I thought? How can this be? I pointed out the different types of dinosaurs but he wasn't having any of it. Mom tried her best to convince him to try it out. Nope he said again "I don't like it!" Then finally this very independent young man said "I think I'll try it." He climbed up and slowly put his head on the new pillow. We both waited and then heard him say "I love my new bed!" I turned to see a tear in Mom's eye as she thanked me. Heading out the door and down the hallway I could still hear him talking about his new bed! On to our next delivery but with another reminder of how important a bed can be to a child and how lucky we are to be able to help.

We have lots of fun St. Patrick's and Easter activities planned. We will also have another Gym Day this month as well.


