

Why is Worship Important?

Some people might say "I know I'm saved by God's grace – why is it a big deal whether or not I attend worship regularly?" My response would be that it IS a big deal for followers of Jesus to participate in worship as frequently as possible, and it's my prayer that in this article I make an effective case for why it's so important.

Joining together as a church "family" in worship plays a huge role in forming us as God's people to live an abundant life as God intended, and to move toward Christ as we live in His Body (the church) and also within the world. Christian worship is a project of making, growing, and living as His disciples. The church, the Body of Christ, is called to extend into and to influence the culture. The activity of worship enables God's people to enact the world as God intends it to be; in other words, we enact (in worship) on Sunday mornings what God intends the world (outside of worship) to look like every day. Worship thus needs to be a

microcosm of our daily lives, and in worship, we rehearse/enact how God would have us behave outside of the sanctuary; to paraphrase Martin Luther, we are to take from the "worship place" of Sunday mornings and live it out in the "marketplace" come Monday morning.

In worship, the church comes together as a family (dysfunctional as it might seem at times!). I once read a biographical article by a pastor who in response to his son's asking "Why do we have to go to church?" answered "we go to church in order to learn to love people that we don't like very much." If we can rehearse and successfully carry out this "loving" in a worship setting, then hopefully we can replicate it out in the world. As a result of this, the content and "messages" communicated during worship should be practically useful in our everyday lives and relationships.

Finally, in worship, the Holy Spirit works through many means (Word, Sacrament, music, art, and

Prayer Quilts Ministry




