As we begin 2019, what better way to do so than a refresher on *Luther's Small Catechism*. Do you still have the catechism memorized? Do you know what you believe and why you believe it? We encourage everyone in the congregation to attend.

When? Pastor Huehn will be teaching a class beginning January 6th-April 14th from 9:25 am – 10:25 am in the parish hall.

Who? This is a class for all who are interested in becoming communicant members of Christ Lutheran as well as for those who need a refresher, which includes everyone in the congregation! Those who are inquiring about becoming members will have the opportunity to join our congregation after completing the class either through adult confirmation, or profession of faith. Please note that if you have a child or children younger than 9th grade, they are required to attend the youth confirmation program to become a communicant member. Please talk to Pr. Fitzner or Pr. Huehn about these requirements.

What? A course on the basic Christian beliefs, teachings, and confessions of Christ Lutheran Church (a congregation of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (www.lcms.org) from the Bible and *Luther's Small Catechism*. A signup sheet will be posted in the entry way to the church as well as by the fellowship hall for prospective members who are inquiring. Please, sign up if you plan to attend. If you will not be able to attend all of the sessions, please talk to Pastor Huehn to arrange a time to meet for a private session on the topic you missed.

Please encourage neighbors, coworkers, friends, or family members to attend.

Cost? There is no cost for those desiring to become new members or those inquiring about the Lutheran faith. New members and inquirers will be provided with *Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation*. We assume that current members already have their own catechism and bible. However, if you do not have the current *Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation*, we would encourage you to purchase your own from cph.org, or call the church office. Please make payments to CLC prior to the class.

HAPPY★NEW★YEAR

It is no secret that God calls us to be generous with the gifts He has given us. Throughout the Bible, we read that just as God has generously given to us, so are we to give generously one to another. As Jesus said, "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35) and "Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful" (Luke 6:36).

But God also calls us to give to Him. And He, who does all things well, presses it into service for the benefit of all the people of God. See for example what God spoke to Moses on Mount Sinai, after he and the people were safely brought out of Egypt across the Red Sea on dry land:

The Lord said to Moses, "Speak to the people of Israel, that they take for me a contribution. From every man whose heart moves him you shall receive the contribution for me. And this is the contribution that you shall receive from them: gold, silver, and bronze, blue and purple and scarlet yarns and fine twined linen, goats' hair, tanned rams' skins, goatskins,[a] acacia wood, oil for the lamps, spices for the anointing oil and for the fragrant incense, onyx stones, and stones for setting, for the ephod and for the breastpiece. And let them make me a sanctuary, that I may dwell in their midst. Exactly as I show you concerning the pattern of the tabernacle, and of all its furniture, so you shall make it. (Ex. 25: 1-9)

Notice in verse two that the Lord instructs Moses to tell the Israelites to "take for me a contribution" and that from everyone motivated from gratitude for what God has just accomplished and given to them, Moses is to gather up "the contribution for me."

Pay attention, though, why the Lord wants the people of Israel to gather up these contributions for Him. God tells Moses precisely why: "let them make me a sanctuary, that I may dwell in their midst." The purpose for the contribution of the Israelites was so that He may dwell with them, that He would live among them. Through the tabernacle and the priesthood, through their rites and ceremonies, through their feasts and festivals, as through means, the Lord God, who brought them out of the bondage of Egypt would live and dwell among them and be their God, and lead them into the promised land, which flowed with milk and honey.

God dwells among us still. In the fullness of time, God's son was born of woman, born under the law to redeem those under the law. He brought us out of bondage to sin, death, the devil, and Hell, and He did this by His obedient suffering and death, his resurrection and ascension. But He is not gone. He dwells with us through the means of His Word and His sacraments, through the preaching and the teaching of our pastors, through the rites and ceremonies of our liturgy. He dwells with us in the Church through those means. And He is leading us to the true promised land, to the new heavens and the new earth in the new creation.

In the meantime, as God, even now, continues to call us to give to Him, let us, who have been saved from slavery to sin and death, the devil and hell, be so moved in our hearts as to give generously to Him so that the means of grace, the means of His gracious dwelling among us, would continue now and into the future. For just as He did then so does He do now. He presses the gifts given to Him into service for the benefit of all His people. He puts it to use so that we may have Him with us always, even unto the end of the age.

Dr. Arthur Just, Associate Executive Director of Regional Operations – Latin America, the Caribbean, and Spain, for LCMS International Missions, will be our mission speaker.

He teaches at Concordia Theological Seminary – Fort Wayne, as well as at Seminario Concordia “El Reformador (SCR) in the Dominican Republic.

He will be preaching at all services the weekend of **January 19 – 20** and teaching the adult Bible class on Sunday morning.

Following the late service on Sunday, January 20th, there will be a **congregational potluck dinner** with Dr. Just.

In early January, watch for sign-up sheets for the dinner. Meat, beverages and table service will be provided. The congregation is asked to bring a dish to pass (salad, vegetable, dessert, etc.)

DR. ARTHUR JUST

Dr. Just has been on the faculty of Concordia Theological Seminary (CTSFW), Fort Wayne, since 1984. He is professor and chairman of Exegetical Theology and director of Spanish Language Church Worker Formation. He teaches New Testament, liturgics, homiletics, catechetics and pastoral theology. He has served as dean of the Chapel, director of Deaconess Studies and co-director of the Good Shepherd Institute of Pastoral Theology and Sacred Music.

He studied at Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut (1982), and at Yale Divinity School (1983-1984), receiving his S.T.M. from Yale in New Testament and Liturgics in 1984. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Durham in England in 1990 in the New Testament. His doctoral thesis, *The Ongoing Feast: Table Fellowship and Eschatology at Emmaus*, was published in 1993 by Pueblo Publishing Company, an imprint of The Liturgical Press.

He has contributed a chapter on “Liturgical Renewal in the Parish” to *Lutheran Worship: History and Practice* by Concordia Publishing House (CPH). He has also written articles on preaching, liturgy and New Testament in various periodicals. He wrote a two-volume commentary on the Gospel of Luke for the *Concordia Commentary Series* (CPH). The first volume appeared in December 1996 and the second volume in November of 1997. He also published the Lukan volume for the *Ancient Christian Commentary on Scripture* from InterVarsity Press, Thomas C. Oden, General Editor (February 2003). He has published two additional books with CPH: one for pastors, deaconesses and laypeople for the visitation of the sick and dying entitled *Visitation*, and another book on the liturgy of the church entitled *Heaven on Earth: The Gifts of Christ in the Divine Service*, a book that expands his video series on the liturgy entitled *Liturgy: Yesterday, Today, and Forever*.

He was chairman of the Lectionary Committee for *Lutheran Service Book* for the Commission on Worship and a member of the Steering Committee.

He and his wife Linda have three children, Abigail, married to the Rev. Joshua Genig, and two sons, Nicholas, married to Haley, and Jacob.
