

Everything sounds better in Latin. Ask your doctor about the various names for parts of the body and he'll probably give you the Latin names. Or ask an ornithologist for the Latin names of a bird. A Northern Cardinal is "Cardinalis cardinalis" and an American Robin is called "Turdus migratorius." It sounds better in Latin!

The Church is the same way, not because it sounds better (which it does) but because for many centuries Latin was the language used by the Western Church (the Eastern Church used Greek). Luther began to change that when he wrote not only in Latin but also in his native language of German. Luther first published the New Testament in German in 1522 and the whole Bible, including the Apocrypha, in 1534. Before this it was rare for the Bible to be in anything other than Latin. The Latin Bible, known as the Vulgate, was first published by St. Jerome in the year 383. William Tyndale was the first to translate the entire New Testament from Greek into English and it was first published in 1526. By then the names for the Sundays of the Church calendar had been in use for centuries already as well as other names and various words used in the liturgies of the Church.

To this day there are several words that the Church doesn't translate but have come into regular use in the Church. *Amen* or *Alleluia* are two examples. They're Hebrew words that we use frequently in the liturgies and hymnody of the Church.

Another example are the names of some Sundays, especially during Advent, pre-Lent, Lent, and Easter. Some of those Latin names used are from the Sunday in relation to Easter but most are taken from the Introit appointed for that day.

During pre-Lent (the three Sundays prior to Ash Wednesday) are named in their relation to how long it is until Easter, or at least an approximate time:

Septuagesima (Latin for "within 70 days")

Sexagesima (Latin for "within 60 days")

Quinquagesima (Latin for "within 50 days")

These three Sundays prepare the faithful for the upcoming season of Lent. Traditions vary by region and congregation: The Gloria in Excelsis or the Alleluia can be omitted. Gradually omitting these parts of the liturgy eases the Church into Lent.

The Sundays of Advent, Lent, and Easter have their names taken from the Introit, taken from the Latin liturgies, with two exceptions: Palm Sunday and Rogate. Palm Sunday is the most obvious, Palmarum simply means "palm." Rogate means "pray." This is the Sunday prior to Ascension Day and prayer is the theme taken from the Gospel lesson. This is also the day when the Church prays for God's blessings upon the soil and the seeds that are planted and for good weather for farmers that the people of God would have a bountiful harvest in the fall and give thanks to God for His many blessings that brings food to our tables.

ADVENT

First Sunday in Advent: *Ad Te Levavi* - "I lift up my soul (to you)" (Isaiah 20:29, 30; 62:11)

Second Sunday in Advent: *Populus Zion* - "People (daughter) of Zion" (Isaiah 62:11b; 30:30, 29)

Third Sunday in Advent: *Gaudete* - "Rejoice" (Philippians 4:4-5)

Gaudete is the halfway point of the Advent season. Some Churches use rose colored paraments and vestments to indicate the lightening of the penitential aspect of the season.

Fourth Sunday in Advent: *Rorate Coeli* - "Let the heavens" (Isaiah 45:8)

LENT

First Sunday in Lent: *Invocabit* – “Call” (Psalm 91: 15–16)

Second Sunday in Lent: *Reminiscere* – “Remember” (Psalm 25: 6, 7)

Third Sunday in Lent: *Oculi* – “Eyes” (Psalm 25: 15–16)

Fourth Sunday in Lent: *Laetare* – “Rejoice” (Isaiah 66:10–11)

Laetare is the halfway point of the Lenten season. Some Churches use rose colored paraments and vestments to indicate the lightening of the penitential aspect of the season.

Fifth Sunday in Lent: *Judica* – “Vindicate/Judge” (Psalm 43: 1–2)

Palm Sunday: *Palmarum* – Latin for “Palm”

EASTER

Second Sunday of Easter: *Quasimodo Geniti* – “As newborn babes” (1 Peter 2: 2)

Third Sunday of Easter: *Misericordias Domini* – “The mercies of the Lord” (Psalm 33: 5–6)

Fourth Sunday of Easter: *Jubilate* – “Joyful shout” (Psalm 66: 1–2)

Fifth Sunday of Easter: *Cantate* – “Sing” (Psalm 98:1–2)

Sixth Sunday of Easter: *Rogate* – Latin for “Pray”

Seventh Sunday of Easter: *Exaudi* – “Listen” (Psalm 27: 7–9)

The lessons, hymns, collects, and all the propers (the parts of the Divine Service that change each Sunday) for each Sunday are a part of the theme of the day. The Latin names for these Sundays communicate those themes.

LCMS Stewardship Newsletter Article

June 2020

The sin of the world is paid for. God’s Law has been kept perfectly on our behalf. The prophecies have all been fulfilled. Jesus Christ has finished it all! And that, dear Christians, should fill us with complete confidence in our salvation. Since Jesus has finished all these things in His self-sacrifice, we can be fully certain our sins are forgiven, and we have everlasting life!

St. Paul wrote: “I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.” (Rom. 12:1)

We hear the same teaching in 1 Peter. “As you come to him, a living stone, rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, you yourselves, like living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.” (1 Peter 2:4-5)

It’s the very thing Malachi foretold of the Lord, that He would come and purify His priestly people, that they may offer to Him an offering in righteousness. (Mal. 3:3)

So, what does this mean? In view of God’s mercies – that is, because Jesus sacrificed Himself to make us pure, giving His entire self into death – Paul said that we are to sacrifice ourselves entirely to God, offering Him our whole lives. For our Savior did not give Himself for us in part. So, we do not give back to Him in part.

We don’t offer ourselves to God just on Sunday mornings or Wednesday evenings, for example. Rather, we give Him our whole selves, all the time. We understand that offering ourselves to God as living sacrifices involves the giving of our time. It requires us to be faithful stewards of the time He has given us. Yes, it means we devote to our Savior all our time. Otherwise we are not sacrificing our whole lives.

You see, God both teaches us, and has graciously qualified us, to present ourselves to Him as living sacrifices – to live as His holy priests, who offer Him acceptable sacrifices through Jesus Christ, all day, every day, in our various callings.

In the passages from Romans and 1 Peter, we hear several examples of Christian self-sacrifice: serving, teaching, encouraging, giving, leading, showing mercy, living peaceably with others, submitting to governing authorities and those over us in the workplace, wives submitting to husbands, husbands honoring wives, showing compassion, and suffering patiently in doing good.

In all these things, and in all our other everyday activities, we sacrifice ourselves by using our time, not just for our own benefit, but also and especially for the well-being of others. Work time, school time, exercise time, study time, mealtime, chore time, recreation and relaxation time, even sleep time – it's all God's gift to us to use for purposes that please and honor Him.

This challenges us to think about the way we spend our time, how we utilize our talents, and the way we spend our treasures. Whatever it is I'm doing, am I doing it "for the Lord"? (Col. 3:23) Am I presenting God a living sacrifice? Am I conducting myself as a holy priest, whose sacrifice is acceptable to God?

Because our Lord sacrificed Himself wholly for us, we offer ourselves wholly to Him as living sacrifices. This is following Jesus in self-sacrifice. By His saving mercy, yes, our sacrifice is acceptable to God. For the sake of Jesus' finished work, God is pleased with us.
