

**What is Lutheran Preaching?
Part 2**

Two months ago in my newsletter, I explored with you, “What is Lutheran preaching?” This month I will expound on a few additional points on what it means to preach the whole counsel of God (Acts 20:27). In essence it means that every sermon be based around three important elements in preaching the full order of salvation for the hearer of the Word. Namely, preaching repentance, faith, and sanctification.

First, Lutheran preaching includes the active work of the Holy Spirit through the Word as it’s preached to lead a hearer to repentance over their sins, pointing them to their sins of omission or commission drawn from the text, and the strengthening of faith through the gospel forgiveness. Sermons must not only speak to the forgiveness of sins only but to the repentance that leads to forgiveness.

Secondly, what follows repentance and forgiveness is one of the most neglected aspects of Lutheran preaching the whole counsel of God. This is the necessity of preaching the new life of the Christian in good works and sanctification as we abide in Christ and Christ abides in us (John 15). By means of the gospel, regenerated, renewed, baptized Christians are encouraged in that identity, to do good works. This isn’t to be preached as a forceful threat or demand for the Christian, but as a loving admonishment. As instruction and training in righteousness are two important needs in preaching, the faithful preacher won’t shy away from thorough teaching on holy virtuous living that Christ desires for His Christians to walk in daily. And did you know that there is more in the *Lutheran Confessions* on good works, the new obedience, and the Christian life than any other topic? It’s most certainly true, even though justification by grace through faith is certainly the foundation on which we stand as Christians. Lutheran preaching isn’t afraid to teach and preach on good works and living the Christian life that flows from justification.

Third, and finally, Lutheran preaching of the whole counsel of God means that there must always be a golden thread of the gospel of Jesus Christ crucified, dead, risen, and ascended for our redemption, atonement, and justification woven into and running through all sermons as it connects the texts for the day, and that the Gospel will always predominate in the Lutheran sermon. This doesn’t necessarily mean that every sermon will have at least 51% gospel and 49% law, or some silly things like that, or even always end with the gospel, but that this golden thread is always running through the sermon at its heart.

There is much more that can be said about Lutheran preaching, but this will have to suffice for now. The Lord continue to bless you as you hear the preaching of God’s Word as the chief means of God’s grace in Jesus Christ in the Divine Service each Lord’s day, and gladly hear and learn it as it is God’s will according to the Third Commandment. God grant it for Jesus’ sake and in Jesus’ name.

His temporal gifts are blessings to and for us, and bring blessing upon us even as they are pressed into His service for His kingdom and the souls that receive them.

Thus we place all that we have into God's hands. He never fails to remember us and pours out the fullness of His promises upon us. We give thanks for all that He has done, is doing and will continue to do. We give thanks by not taking for ourselves, but giving to all even as our heavenly Father has given to us.

As we prepare for Thanksgiving celebrations, may we all give thanks continually for all that we are and all that we have because of God's providential care. And may we be all the more diligent in bringing everything that we have received from God to Him, so that He may bless it and employ it for the good of all — even for us. For to the one who has, more will be given, and he will have an abundance.

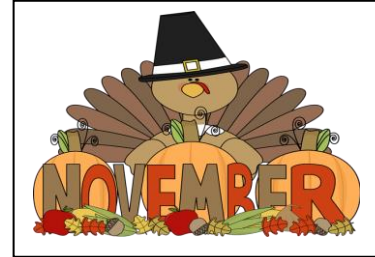
