What's the Rush?

November 1st, All Saints' Day...that's when it began. It seemed to start far earlier than it usually does. For whatever reason, people waited until the day after Halloween and that was all the longer they could hold back. That was the day that Christmas came early. Usually, it holds off until the day after Thanksgiving. If people aren't out looking for doorbusters then it's that Friday that the decorations start going up. But not this year. It started on All Saints' Day.

The Monday before Thanksgiving I was at the bank and as I chatted with the gentleman behind the counter, I noticed that Christmas music was playing and I said, "Why are they playing Christmas music? It's not even Thanksgiving." As I was dressed in my usual clergy attire he retorted back, "I thought you would appreciate it." To which I said, "No, Christmas doesn't start until December 25th, it doesn't end." The look on his face was priceless. He seems shocked and confused. I went on to tell him that in the Church, Christmas starts on December 24th and the 12 days of Christmas ends on January 5th. The 12 days of Christmas doesn't start on December 14th. He asked why does everyone think it ends on the 25th? Because nobody likes to wait, and the world doesn't understand what Christmas is about.

It all starts with Advent. On the heels of the Last Sunday of the Church Year (when we hear the parable of the Ten Virgins – Matthew 25:1-13), the First Sunday of Advent begins the new Church Year. That's when we hear of Palm Sunday (Matthew 21:1-9), Jesus our King coming to redeem His people, as He will do in majesty on the Last Day. Then we hear the warnings of the Last Day to be watchful (Luke 21:25-36). After that is the comfort that Jesus brings (Isaiah 40:1-11; Matthew 11:2-11) as He comes to us in mystery (Word and Sacraments). Finally, on the Fourth Sunday of Advent we hear the blessed Virgin Mary sing the Magnificat (Luke 1:39-56) and bless the Lord for all He has done as He comes in history and was born in Bethlehem and laid in the manger.

The evening (sundown) of December 24th is when Christmas begins. The Church gathers to watch with the shepherds and hear the message of the angels. Then on the 25th the Church celebrates Christmas (the Mass of Christ) and she continues to celebrate for 12 days!

But every year I get called a *grinch* or a *curmudgeon* or a *Scrooge* and I'm told, "*you just hate Christmas*." False. I don't hate Christmas. I don't like to put the cart before the horse. What's the rush? Why do things the way the world does it? The world doesn't have a clue what Christmas is about, even less about Advent. *Christmas is a worship service*. It's not decorations, presents, food, or family. It's Jesus and receiving Him by faith as He serves His people in the Divine Service.

No, I'm not trying to put a damper on your Christmas spirit or celebrations. I'm saying that it's ok, and it's a good thing, to slow down. There's wisdom in how the Church does things with Advent and the 12 days of Christmas. It forces you to slow down and meditate and ponder Christ who came in history, who comes to you now in mystery, and who will come again in majesty. What's the rush? The world keeps time. The Church has time.

Something to think about: Imagine starting to celebrate Easter at the beginning of Lent. Sounds crazy, right? So why do it with Christmas and Advent?

The Measure of Our Generosity

If you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8–11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regulation no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?




