Never Retreat. Never Surrender.

One of my favorite movies is the 1970 film, "Patton," starring George C. Scott. The real General Patton had one standing order for his troops: Never dig in. In other words, the general always wanted his troops on the offensive, always putting pressure on the enemy. There would be no time to dig foxholes on the battlefield because they were always advancing, always moving forward, always fighting for victory. Patton's 3rd Army was very successful in Europe during World War II. They endured the horrific Battle of the Bulge outside of Bastogne and broke through the enemy lines breaking up the German offensive in 1944.

While this order might be problematic at times for worldly conflicts and for standing armies on the battlefield, it is true for Christians. Never dig in. Never retreat. Never surrender. As I write this, we're a little over three weeks past Christmas. The Scripture lessons and hymns of that glorious season are fresh in my memory. Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent is approaching quickly. This year Ash Wednesday falls on St. Valentine's Day, February 14th. So will begin the 40-day journey following Jesus through the wilderness as He is tempted by the devil and as He succeeds where ancient Israel failed on their 40-year wandering in the wilderness. For you, the fight of Lent is against the flesh, heart, and mind that are turned against the Lord. The fight is against sin that lurks within our members. The fight is against the devil who lies, cheats, and steals. Against sin, death, and the devil: NEVER RETREAT! NEVER SURRENDER!

During Lent, we hear "our Lord's call to intensify our struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that prevents us from trusting in God and loving each other" (Holy Thursday liturgy). While this fight goes on every day of our lives, Lent is a time the church sets to intensify that fight as we prepare for the events of Holy Week and the resurrection of our Lord. Jesus fights the devil in the wilderness and He is victorious. Jesus fights the temptations of the flesh and He is victorious. Jesus strives with death and He conquers death by swallowing up death forever by death. That victory is made yours through faith. Jesus is by our side upon the plain (LSB 656:4). Jesus is with us on the battlefield, shielding His people from every harm (LSB 401:5). Jesus, who changes not, His arms are near (LSB 664:4). Follow Christ, your Lord, and take the cross appointed. Cling firmly to His Word and in suffering be undaunted. For you who bear the battle's strain, you will receive the crown of heavenly life (LSB 688:5) because Jesus lives! The victory's won! (LSB 490).

You may have noticed lately that I've begun wearing a metal bracelet on my right arm. On it, there are engraved the words, "NEVER RETREAT | NEVER SURRENDER" along with an engraving of a cross. It's a reminder to me of my baptism. It's a reminder to continue to fight against temptation and sin and that I don't fight alone. Jesus stands with me. The holy angels stand around me. Sin and death no longer have dominion over me (Romans 6:9).

As we enter the season of Lent, never dig in. Heed your Lord's call to intensify your struggle against sin, death, and the devil.

Caring for My Neighbor

If any of the Ten Commandments might tempt us to think that keeping the Law is easy, it would be the Fifth Commandment. After all, how hard is it to get through life without murdering somebody? The vast majority of people can handle that!

But Jesus famously blows up this notion by pointing out that the command, "you shall not murder," goes much deeper — down to the heart.

You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. (Matt. 5:21–22)

Hatred and disdain come from the same sort of crookedness of heart as murder. With both murder and hatred, you look down on another person and think them of little worth.

In the Small Catechism, Luther also points out that every "do not" in the commandments also includes a "do this:" "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but help and support him in every physical need" (SC, Fifth Commandment, emphasis added).

We are not called merely to avoid evil; we must also do positive good.

So when Jesus drew near to us and became our neighbor by taking up our humanity, He came not only to avoid harming us, but He came to positively help us, bless us and serve us.

We are now called to show the love to our neighbors that Christ showed to us. Your neighbor is yet another gift that God has given you that requires your stewardship. We are called to show mercy, to be kind, to love and serve our neighbor. One aspect of this stewardship is financial: our neighbors need us to support the church's work so that they can hear the Gospel and come to faith. Our neighbors need the church's alms and mercy work. Our neighbors need our faithful service in all we do in the name of Christ.

2024 Lenten Series – "Honest Repentance": What does true repentance look like? "Repentance starts with being honest before God and ourselves about who we are. When it comes to sin, everyone has a natural impulse to hide, but repentance means finding the courage to be honest." Each text draws from Scripture readings traditionally assigned for the Easter Vigil to explore what repentance is — and what a life of repentance looks like. "In the context of the Easter Vigil, these readings capture the broad sweep of God's saving acts in the Bible, culminating in Baptism, which traditionally takes place at the vigil."


