Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I have to admit that Sunday morning between 10 and about 11:15 is my absolute favorite time of the week. Even if I have had a stressful, difficult week, once I introduce myself and say, "It is my joy to welcome you to worship..." my words and how I feel connect and I feel, well...joyful.

There are even some Sundays when the words of a hymn I particularly like grabs my heart, and the sense of God's presence and love overshadows everything else and I find tears clouding my eyes and I struggle a bit to keep my emotion in check.

I love worship and I think that God calling us to church to **worship together** is absolute grace.

opportunity to be generous in the giving of an offering, the sermon, and finally the blessed invitation to be fed at the Lord's table – all of these elements combine together in a holy amalgam that blesses and lifts the community of the faithful, reminding us that we are God's children and that God loves us, in spite of our inadequacies and

failings, not because we necessarily deserve it but because God is good...all the time.

Now, let me be clear, I am not saying that every element of our worship service every Sunday is flawless or that there aren't awkward and perhaps even boring elements in each worship service. Sometimes sections of the Scripture are impenetrable, or our singing falls flat, or the sermon doesn't quite come together in the way I had hoped. However, in spite of whatever inadequacies, there is always something in the service that points us to Christ and that touches us with grace. Even if it is just one moment of grace, one thing that touches our heart...that is enough to lift us.

What saddens me about Sunday worship is when I consider who is not there and who is missing out.

- \* The folks who are on our members list, yet who skip church more than they attend. They are missing out.
- \* The spiritual seekers in our community who are looking for something, but are afraid to come to church because they are afraid they are not really welcomed in church or that they will be judged or criticized. They are missing out.
- \* The people who have just never been involved or invited to church, who don't know the rhythms of worship, or who think church is for their parents or grandparents, or for people other than themselves. They are missing out.

It is God who calls us together to worship, who speaks to us through the Word and who feeds us at the table of grace. The Holy **continued on top of next page**

## Stewardship Corner by Janet Adams



The mission statement from Lutheran World Relief's website states: "Lutheran World Relief is a non-profit organization that works with local partners to provide lasting solutions to poverty, injustice and human suffering". While I am sure most Lutherans are well-versed in LWR's global role, I am always heartened and often amazed at the scope of the outreach. I learned much about the nature of LWR's services when my mother-in-law and father-in-law worked with families in Kauai after the 1992 onslaught of Hurri-

Iniki. They lived in Kauai for several years helping reconstruct demolished residences and assisting families struggling to rebuild their lives. Hence, I often think of LWR as crisis or disaster oriented, which is an incomplete picture of the outreach services provided.

According to LWR's website, 1,763,599 lives and thirty-five countries were reached through 153 projects in 2014. One such project is the distribution of school kits throughout the world.

#### According to LWR:

"Why school supplies? To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. And when parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority...yet **the** education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development."

Which brings us to the reality that God's stewards answer the call locally, in a small way, to make a difference globally in a big way through "...lasting solutions..." We are not sending supplies or continued on page 9

We will be reading and discussing Anne Lamott's book on prayer titled, Help, Thanks, Wow. All are


invited to join us. We meet in the Fireside Room.
