### September Worship Themes & Scripture Readings

September 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> – *One of the greatest accomplishments of Satan is tricking people into believing he is not real. After all, if people think he does not exist, then they aren't prepared for his attacks. Today, however, the apostle Paul reminds us of the reality of the old evil foe. Satan and his threats are real, but God does not leave us defenseless. We are to **"take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm"** (Ephesians 6:13). When Paul calls us to put on the full armor of God, the pieces of armor are all given in the one garment we put on in Holy Baptism. Clothed in Christ and His strength, we are able to stand against Satan, confident that even though he is a real threat, we need not fear!*

September 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> (Rally Sunday) – *Sometimes when a student does a good job on an assignment, the teacher will reward him or her with a gold star. A gold star is a symbol for a job well done. Yet, not every assignment that a student completes is handed back with a gold star on top. Not every test or paper is done well. Jesus, however, is different. The crowds in today's Gospel proclaim with astonishment, **"He has done all things well"** (Mark 7:37). The people are right: Jesus can do only good because He is God, and God is good! In His healing, preaching, and teaching, He does all things well. Even right up to the end as He cries out from the cross, **"It is finished,"** Jesus does His Father's will with gold-star perfection. With His death, resurrection, and eventual return, Jesus has done, and will do, all things well.*

September 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> – (Concordia University – St. Paul Sunday!) *There will be a representative Pastor from CUSP who will be leading us in our Saturday Evening and Sunday Morning Worship. There will also be a presentation during the SS Education Hour to hear about all the exciting things that are happening on Campus. This would be a great time to ask any questions you may have of CUSP. A special Door Offering will be taken following the service.*

September 22<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup> – *Though the Old Testament Reading happened about 2,600 years ago, it portrays a circumstance that may ring familiar to many of us. The prophet Jeremiah faithfully proclaimed God's Word to an increasingly unfaithful people. Their anger and attempts to silence Jeremiah blindsided him. If he was doing God's will, shouldn't people appreciate and thank him? We like to hear **"feel good"** stories about people today being faithful to God and receiving respect and adulation in return. But we also hear stories—and sometimes live real-life events—where we act or speak in Christian kindness, yet get blindsided by an angry or ungrateful response. The rejection of Jeremiah points forward to Jesus' rejection by His own people. Blindsided by both Judas who betrayed Him and Peter who denied Him, Jesus persevered in faithfully fulfilling His mission to suffer, die, and be raised for the very people who despised Him. In those times when we are blindsided by negative reactions to God's will for the world, our Savior empathizes with us and sustains us by the Holy Spirit. And because of the Father's love for us in Christ, there are times even now when we are blindsided by Jesus' mercy though we know we don't deserve it.*

September 29<sup>th</sup> & 30<sup>th</sup> – *Moses said, **"Would that all the Lord's people were prophets, that the Lord would put His Spirit on them!"** (Numbers 11:29). Jesus said, **"For no one who does a mighty work in My name will be able soon afterward to speak evil of Me. For the one who is not against us is for us"** (Mark 9:39–40). Everyone expects a Christian pastor to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Quite often, however, the Gospel is preached by an ordinary Christian to a neighbor. The issue is not always who is preaching, but that the mighty Word of God be spoken, applied, and echoed throughout the world.*

### Worship and Bible Study Attendance

*"Too often what we do in the Church is influenced or even directed by the word of a fallen humanity instead of the Word of the Lord. If the Word of God is not part of the daily diet of members the congregation will begin to look more and more like the way of a fallen world. When this is the case there is anger at the mere thought that members be expected to attend a Bible class". (Mech, Pastors and Elders, 24-25)*

Is it important to attend Worship? Is it important to attend Bible Study? Absolutely, without a doubt! The First Commandment states *"You shall have no other gods"* and the Third Commandment states *"Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy."* If you are not attending worship, if you are not learning more about God through His Word, what is it that is starting to become or has become the *"idol"* or *"god"* in place of the one and only Triune God in your life? This is a law question that stings when we hear it. Now hear the gospel response. We have a loving, redeeming, Savior who has taken all of our sin and rebellion against God, and carried it upon His

shoulders as He was raised upon a cross and there redeemed us through the shedding of His blood so that you could be forgiven of all your sins. That is grace upon grace!

There will be more opportunities provided for you to be part of a Bible Study here at Christ Lutheran Church this year. Beginning on September 9<sup>th</sup> a Tuesday Evening Bible Study @ 6pm will be offered for those who are unable to attend the Sunday Morning Bible Study. The same study offered on Sunday Morning will be offered on the following Tuesday Evening. If neither Sunday Morning nor Tuesday Evenings work into your schedule talk to Pastor Hahn to see if something may be arranged. The goal is that **everyone** attends a weekly Worship Service and Bible Study at CLC.

### **Confirmation Instruction Parent/Student Orientation Meeting**

There will be an informative meeting of the Confirmation parents and students on Wednesday, September 12<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm. Confirmation instruction is for all youth in 6<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> grade or up to 12<sup>th</sup> grade who have not had Confirmation Instruction in the Lutheran Church. It is a two year program going through the 6 Chief parts of the Christian Faith from Luther's Small Catechism and an overview of the Old and New Testaments. It is important that you are present because we may be changing the dates and times of when Instruction Class will take place. I have 3 different options from keeping everything the same as it was to just meeting once a month on a Sunday afternoon to a combination of the above. I hope to see you there. 
I'm thankful to be working at Christ Lutheran and I look forward to meeting many more of the wonderful members of the church.



## The Peacemakers

### Chapter 5 – Conflict Starts in the Heart

As part of the Elder's goals for 2018, we are working our way through the book, *The Peacemakers* by Ken Sande. Each Elders meeting has time devoted to discussing each of the chapters in the book. In August, the Elders and Pastor reviewed Chapter 5, *Conflict Starts in the Heart*. This is the second chapter in Part 2 of the *Peacemakers* titled, *Get the Log Out of Your Eye*. Here are some of the ideas and thoughts from this chapter.

The chapter started out with a discussion the basic root of all conflict, unmet desires in our own hearts. Several passages address this sinfulness, including James 4; 1-3, "*What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within you? You want something but don't get it. You kill and covet, but you cannot have what you want. You quarrel and fight. You do not have, because you do not ask God. When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with the wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures.*" Understanding the root of the conflict is key to effectively addressing conflicts and reconciling the conflict.

Conflict always begins with some kind of desire. Some desires are inherently wrong like vengeance, lust and greed. Other desires are not inherently wrong like desiring peace and quiet, grandchildren, success or a growing and prosperous church. If something or someone is standing in your way to a good desire, we should talk about it. Through the conversation, we can discover ways to fulfill the desire in a Christian manner that benefits everyone.

Unmet desires, even small ones can grow and fester in our minds. These unmet desires can form into a mindset that we are "owed" the desire and demand it. This is a form of idolatry. While most of us think of idol worship as paying homage to a wood or stone carving, the concept of idolatry is much broader than that. An idol is anything apart from God that we depend on to be happy, fulfilled or secure. In biblical terms it is something we set our hearts on apart from God.

Idolatrous demands thinking usually lead us to judge other people. While we can offer counsel to others in a truly Christian manner that is to correct behaviors, we cross the line when we sinfully judge others. This is characterized by feelings of superiority, indignation, condemnation, bitterness and resentment. Sinfully judging others shows an absence of genuine love and concern for one another.

Once the sinful judging begins, this form of idol worship demands a sacrifice. When someone fails to satisfy our demands and expectations, no matter how small, our idol worship demands that the person should suffer. As James 4:1-3 teaches, inflicting pain on others is one of the surest signs that an idol is ruling our hearts. When we catch ourselves punishing others in anyway, whether deliberate and overt, or subtle, it is a warning that something other than God is ruling our hearts.

How do we remedy idol worship in our lives? Jesus points us to his command to love God, fear God and trust God. To receive the forgiveness and freedom from our sinful idol worship, we must acknowledge our sin, repent of it and put our trust in Jesus Christ who died for our sins. God has established the church to channel his grace to you and to strengthen your faith, trust and love in God. By being involved in a solid biblical church and seek regular fellowship with mature believers, we can recognize our own sinfully behaviors and seek reconciliation with fellow Christians.


