

THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION






THE AGNUS DEI ("LAMB OF GOD")





THE LORD'S PRAYER

¹⁴ "I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

THE NICENE CREED


