Stick Around for the End by Pastor Van Kampen

"And the LORD restored Job's losses when he prayed for his friends. Indeed the LORD gave Job twice as much as he had before... Now the LORD blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning." (Job 42:10, 12, NKJV)



At forty-two chapters, the Book of Job is a difficult read. Much of the action happens in the first two chapters. The Lord allows Satan to take everything from Job—his home, his wealth, the lives of his children, even Job's health. Job is left in the ashes of his life with

absolutely nothing but a broken potsherd. Then, starting in the third chapter, Job's friends pay him a visit. Yet instead of comforting Job in his suffering, they spend the majority of the book trying to convince Job that his suffering is his own fault. For a long time the story does not look like it will end well. The faint-of-heart reader might be tempted to give up on Job's story halfway.

But then you'd never find out what happens at the end! "And the LORD restored Job's losses... Indeed the LORD gave Job twice as much as he had before" (Job 42:10). Everything that Job had lost, he regained by God's gracious hand—even twice as much! Job's blessings toward the end of his life were greater than the beginning (Job 42:12)! It's important to stick around for the end!

That's the encouragement God's Word gives us in our own lives: to stick around for the end. Life can often be frustrating. Job loss, illness, disease, the loss of a loved one—these things leave us asking, "Lord, why?" Things can look so hopeless that we are ready to give up.

Yet we can stick around for the end, trusting that God is going to give us the best ending of all. As they led Jesus out to be crucified, it looked like the end of the story. That's what His disciples thought. Yet God had a different idea. On the morning of the third day when the women reported that the tomb was empty, Jesus' disciples didn't understand. But then their risen Lord appeared to them. He pointed to His hands and His feet, and then opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, how His suffering and death were necessary to take away the sin of the world, to understand that by His death Jesus has destroyed death for us all, and that now we get to live with Him forever.

And the crucified and risen Lord Jesus, who died and rose for us, makes us this promise: "Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life." (Rev 2:10) We have the hope that the God who so graciously blessed His servant Job will also bless us, and that our latter days—the days we spend in eternal life with our Savior—will be greater than the beginning. So, don't give up halfway through. Stick around for the end of the story. Have a blessed Easter in the peace of our Lord's resurrection!

"CREATED"—LYA 2023

The ELS Board for Youth Outreach is excited to announce that the 2023 LYA Youth Convention will be held at Bethany Lutheran College from Thursday, July 27 - Sunday, July 30. This annual event brings together youth from across the country. The Convention theme is "Created" (based on Genesis 1:27) and will feature keynote speaker, Bethany Lutheran Theological Seminary President Rev. Timothy Hartwig. Early Registration is February 15-June 1 at a cost of \$250/person. Late registration (after June 1) will cost \$300/person. Open to confirmed youth (exceptions can be made for groups bringing those in confirmation). Every church needs to send at least one youth leader/chaperone of the same gender as the students (consider paying their way as a church). If your church is unable to send a youth leader/chaperone, consider partnering with another congregation. The reduced cost is subsidized by the ELS Board for Youth Outreach. The fee includes either zip-lining or kayaking as an activity; as well as the student's choice for all Sectionals and Master Classes. (Activities, Sectionals, & Master Classes will have limited capacity: register early to ensure your top picks for classes and activities!)
