Looking Up by Pastor Van Kampen

Over a cup of coffee, an acquaintance asks, "So, why do you go to church?" How do you answer? We could say lots of things, couldn't we? Yet perhaps we can find an answer in the events of Jesus' ascension to heaven.

Forty days after He came back to life, Jesus took His resurrection body and went up to heaven. The day it happened, all the disciples were there looking up as Jesus ascended into the sky, higher and higher until the cloud blocked Him from their sight.

too—looking for Jesus. Our minds are full of questions—prayers, really. "Lord, where are You?" "Why is there so much chaos in my life, Lord?" "What will happen to my sick relative?" "What am I supposed to do, Lord?" "Lord, when are you coming back to take me out of this mess and lead me to heaven?"

Those "looking up" questions are reflected for us in the words of the liturgy. We pray them every time we sing the words, "Lord, have mercy upon us." In that look ahead with the confidence of Scripture's short little piece of music we ask the Lord to take care of our needs and to give us answers to our questions.

Later, we continue to spiritually look up to heaven when we pray (even though our heads may be bowed). In the prayers we pray each week, we ask God to provide for our specific needs and for the needs of others.

But worship is not all about looking up. When the disciples could no longer see Jesus, two angels appeared, standing with them. They had a message: "Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven." (Acts 1:11). Jesus had gone to heaven-but He wasn't gone. He was still with them. And one day He would come back. Jesus would keep all of His promises. They went back to Jerusalem that day rejoicing in the assurance that as their Lord Jesus would so all that He said He would do. The Word of God had given them strength to look ahead.

That's what coming to church does for us too. Here the Gospel assures us that Christ has taken care of everything—that our sins are forgiven, that our heavenly home is prepared for us, and that He will one day take us to be with Him. In the meantime, He reigns at God's right hand, working all things for our good.

God's Word gives us the strength to look ahead and At church we find ourselves looking up to heaven face our lives, to do the things that need doing—that God Himself has laid out for us to do. To endure hardship, to serve those who need us, to take care of our work—trusting that Christ is with us, keeping His promises.

This year the Holy Christian Church celebrates Christ's Ascension on May 18. May our risen and Ascended Lord continually inspire us to look up to heaven with our questions and prayers, and then to answers—not always easy answers, but always comforting answers in Christ our Savior.

Lord keep us heavenly minded so that we may be of earthly good. Amen.

CREATED"—LYA 2023

The ELS Board for Youth Outreach is excited to announce that the 2023 LYA Youth Convention will be held at Bethany Lutheran College from Thursday, July 27 - Sunday, July 30. This annual event brings together youth from across the country. The Convention theme is "Created" (based on Genesis 1:27) and will feature keynote speaker, Bethany Lutheran Theological Seminary President Rev. Timothy Hartwig. Early Registration is February 15-June 1 at a cost of \$250/ person. Late registration (after June 1) will cost \$300/ person. Open to confirmed youth (exceptions can be made for groups bringing those in confirmation). Every church needs to send at least one youth leader/ chaperone of the same gender as the students (consider paying their way as a church). If your church is unable to send a youth leader/chaperone, consider partnering with another congregation. The reduced cost is subsidized by the ELS Board for Youth Outreach. The fee includes either zip-lining or kayaking as an activity; as well as the student's choice for all Sectionals and Master Classes. (Activities, Sectionals, & Master Classes will have limited capacity: register early to ensure your top picks for classes and activities!)
