





Since Pastor Van Kampen left, there has been an initial dip in attendance. Hopefully this will go back up. **Motion was made, seconded and approved to accept Pastor's report and pass on to the congregational meeting.**

REVIEW OF COMMITTEE REPORTS A-J

<u>Kitchen Committee</u> – Besides the report, Tonneke Van Kampen resigned as chair of the committee due to her move to Madison, WI. The committee members (and the congregation) thank Tonneke for chairing the committee and sharing great ideas.

<u>Board of Elders Report</u> – Elders approved the transfer of Pastor S. Piet and Charity Van Kampen and Harmen to Holy Cross Ev. Lutheran Church, Madison. Elders approved the transfer request from Pastor Roger Holtz from Trinity Ev. Lutheran Church (WELS), Kaukauna, WI, and Anna Noll by profession of faith.

<u>Council Report</u> – The Council Report was reviewed. Brian Busse pointed out that we are losing three ushers. We reduced from four to three usher groups. A couple ushers have agreed to be on more than one group. If anyone is interested in being an usher, please let Brian Busse know.

Motion was made and seconded to approve the Committee Reports, Board of Elders Report and Council Report and pass on to the congregational meeting.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – First three line items were combined after Pastor Van Kampen left. A chart (separate page) shows expenses for Pastor Van Kampen's, Vacancy Pastor and visiting pastors. Visiting pastors are paid \$175 plus mileage. Expenses were 64% of budget which is under budget.

This is highlight of line items over budget:

Line 8 – Purchase of wine (thank you Charles and Barbara Hartwig for purchasing wine on last trip to Minnesota)

Line 12 – VBS ads for June and July, postage and cost to change dates on banner.

Line 16 – Workers Comp increased by \$900 and will show in October's expenses.

Line 21 – Lawn care – weeds were taken care of, good job overall.

Line 25 – Offering envelopes and #10 business envelopes.

Line 34 – Erik Van Kampen for Bethany College.

Third quarter offerings cover expenditures. End-of-quarter checkbook balance after offerings and other deposits was \$67,519.54. Budget expenditures include \$50,000 for a CD at 5.3%. General savings balance at end of quarter is \$1,565.37.

Motion was made and seconded to approve Treasurer's reports and pass on to the congregational meeting.

New Business

- Vacancies were voted on as follows: Vice President (two-year term through Dec 2025) Charles Hartwig, Secretary (two-year term through Dec 2025), Elders President Paul
 Koch appointed himself to finish out the year for Ben Brodhagen who resigned for
 personal reasons. We will vote for an Elder in January. Elder (two-year term) Daniel
 Lindquist, Bd of Trustees John Greenwood, Bd of Evangelism Julie Larson and
 Daniel Meves. Thank you to James Van Kampen for his service on Evangelism.
- 2. Archivist/Historian Julie Larsen accepted this position It will be a three-year term. Julie will write a description and duties for the position.
- Church Security Charles Hartwig raised the question about keeping outside door locked during any worship service or other activities due to the threats against Christians and Jews. We agreed to do this and ushers will open the door to anyone coming in late.
