We are glad to have you with us as we gather before our almighty and saving God to hear His holy and powerful Word and celebrate His life-giving Sacraments, offering our prayers and praises as He strengthens our faith and brings us ever closer to our eternal home with Him.

SERVICE NOTES

In Jesus' baptism, as prophesied in today's Psalm, the Father marks him as his Son, the promised Messiah, the one who perfectly fulfills the Father's will for our salvation. In our first reading, God's prophet introduces this promised Savior to the world. It is too small a thing for him to be just the Savior of the Jews. "I will also make you a light for the Gentiles, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth" (Isaiah 49.6). Then our second reading shows us that in Baptism, we are made the beneficiaries of what he came to do. Our lives are fundamentally changed. Romans 6 nicely complements the Gospel in that it connects each of us to the work Jesus accomplished in his baptism and to the One who was baptized. Jesus' baptism shows him as our perfect substitute.

PSALM OF THE DAY

Psalm 111

M: Praise the Lord!

C: I will praise the Lord with my whole heart, in the assembly of the upright and in the congregation.

M: The works of the Lord are great, studied by all who have pleasure in them.

C: His work is honorable and glorious, and His righteousness endures forever.

M: He has made His wonderful works to be remembered; The Lord is gracious and full of compassion. He has given food to those who fear Him;

C: He will be mindful of His covenant. He has declared to His people the power of His works, in giving them the heritage of the nations.

M: The works of His hands are verity and justice; all His precepts are sure.

C: They stand fast forever and ever, and are done in truth and uprightness.

M: He has sent redemption to His people; He has commanded His covenant forever:

C: Holy and awesome is His name.

FIRST LESSON: Isaiah 45:20-25

²⁰ "Gather together and come; assemble, you fugitives from the nations. Ignorant are those who carry about idols of wood, who pray to gods that cannot save. ²¹ Declare what is to be, present it—let them take counsel together. Who foretold this long ago, who declared it from the distant past? Was it not I, the Lord? And there is no God apart from me, a righteous God and a Savior; there is none but me.

²² "Turn to me and be saved, all you ends of the earth; for I am God, and there is no other. ²³ By myself I have sworn, my mouth has uttered in all integrity a word that will not be revoked: Before me every knee will bow; by me every tongue will swear. ²⁴ They will say of me, 'In the Lord alone are deliverance and strength.'" All who have raged against him will come to him and be put to shame. ²⁵ But all the descendants of Israel will find deliverance in the Lord and will make their boast in him.

M: But Thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us.



SECOND LESSON: Colossians 3:12-17

¹² Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. ¹³ Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. ¹⁴ And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

¹⁵ Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. ¹⁶ Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts. ¹⁷ And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

GOSPEL LESSON: LUKE 2:25-40

²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. ²⁶ It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ²⁷ Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts.

When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, ²⁸ Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying: ²⁹ "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss^[a] your servant in peace. ³⁰ For my eyes have seen your salvation, ³¹ which you have prepared in the sight of all nations: ³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel." ³³ The child's father and Mother marveled at what was said about him. ³⁴ Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, ³⁵ so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too."

³⁶ There was also a prophet, Anna, the daughter of Penuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷ and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. ^[b] She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. ³⁸ Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

³⁹ When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰ And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him.






